**OLD TESTAMENT** **Isaiah 58:3-9** *The Lord, your light, your guide*

'Why have we fasted, and you see it not? Why have we humbled ourselves,  
and you take no knowledge of it?' Behold, in the day of your fast you seek your  
own pleasure, and oppress all your workers. Behold, you fast only to quarrel and  
to fight and to hit with a wicked fist. Fasting like yours this day will not make  
your voice to be heard on high.

Is such the fast that I choose, a day for a person to humble himself? Is it to  
bow down his head like a reed, and to spread sackcloth and ashes under him?  
Will you call this a fast, and a day acceptable to the LORD?

"Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo  
the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?  
Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into  
your house; when you see the naked, to cover him, and not to hide yourself  
from your own flesh?

Then shall your light break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring  
up speedily; your righteousness shall go before you; the glory of the LORD shall  
be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer; you shall cry,  
and he will say, 'Here I am.'

**EPISTLE** **1 Corinthians 2:1-12** *God's wisdom, Christ crucified*

And I, when I came to you, brothers, did not come proclaiming to you the  
testimony of God with lofty speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing  
among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. And I was with you in  
weakness and in fear and much trembling, and my speech and my message  
were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of  
power, that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of  
God. Yet among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom  
of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away.

But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before  
the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this, for if they  
had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.

But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of  
man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him"--- these things  
God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything,  
even the depths of God. For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of  
that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God  
except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but  
the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us  
by God.

**HOLY GOSPEL** **Matthew 5:13-20** *The sermon on the mount*

[Jesus said] "You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how  
shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be  
thrown out and trampled under people's feet.

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do  
people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light  
to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that  
they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not  
come to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and  
earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is  
accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these  
commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the  
kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called  
great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds  
that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

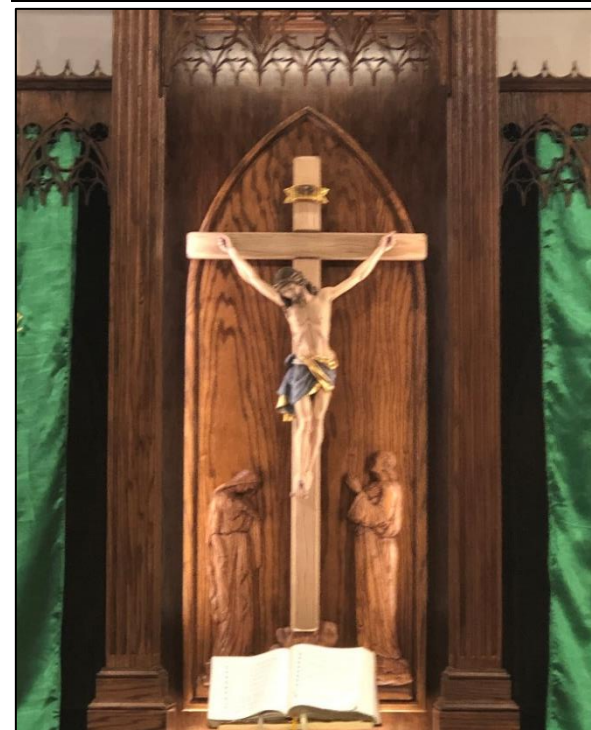

## 5<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY FEBRUARY 5, 2023

**Welcome to the Lord's House. The Righteousness of Christ.** Jesus warns that "unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:20), but He also calls His imperfect people "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world" (Matt. 5:13,14). That's because the Lord Jesus came not to abolish the Law or the prophets, "but to fulfill them" (Matt. 5:17) in perfect faith and love. Since He does and teaches all of God's commandments, He is "called great in the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:19). God manifests His "demonstration of the Spirit and of power" in "Jesus Christ and him crucified" (1 Cor. 2:2-4), and through the preaching of the Gospel He gives His "secret and hidden wisdom" (1 Cor. 2:7). Christ gives this perfect righteousness to His people, and it leads them to true fasting, which is "to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free" (Is. 58:6) and "to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house" (Is. 58:7). **The Lord bless this Divine Service.**
