OLD TESTAMENT **Isaiah 62:1-7**

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch. The nations shall see your righteousness, and all the kings your glory, and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married. For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you. On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be silent. EPISTLE **Romans 10:11-17**

For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

But how are they to call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

HOLY GOSPEL **Luke 5:1-11**

On one occasion, while the crowd was pressing in on Jesus to hear the word of God, he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.

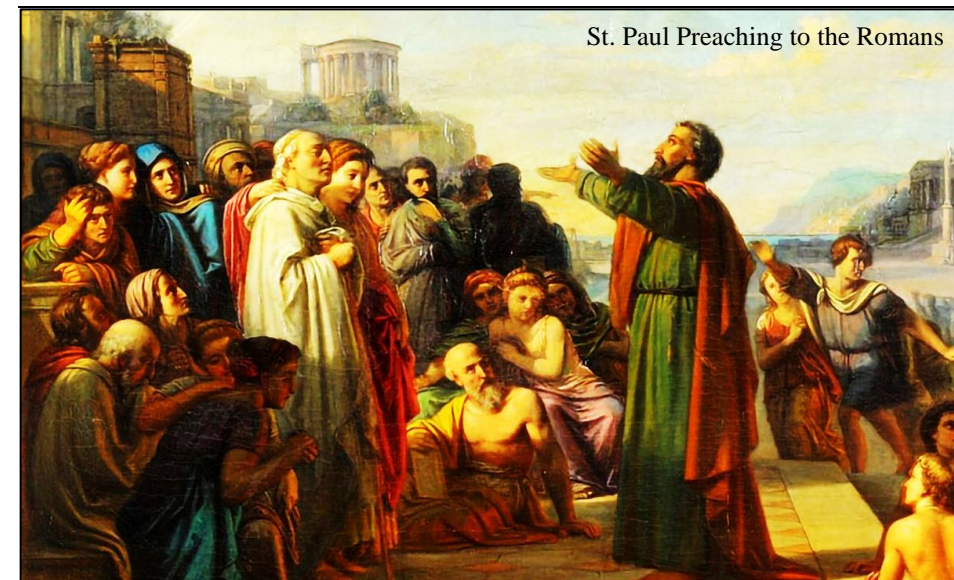

MISSION OBSERVANCE – SIBERIAN LUTHERAN SEMINARY

Welcome to the Lord's House. Today we welcome Rev. Dr. Timothy Quill with Siberian Lutheran Seminary. The Lord Sends His Church to Proclaim Repentance for the Forgiveness of Sins to All. The Lord called fishermen to be fishers of men (Luke 5:1–11). The Lord sends His apostles out to proclaim "repentance for the forgiveness of sins" in Jesus' name "to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." They are His witnesses (Luke 24:47-48). Thus, the Church has her sacred task until the Lord returns. She is an apostolic Church because she is sent. The Lord sends preachers among her and from her midst to preach the Gospel, that many may hear and through this hearing may believe and call "on the name of the Lord" and "be saved" (Rom. 10:11-17). For this the Scriptures were given (Luke 24:44-46): to testify of Christ. "I will not keep silent ... until [the Church's] righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch" (Is. 62:1). The Church prays for her pastors and missionaries and supports them. Isaiah lends his encouragement: "You who put the LORD in remembrance, take no rest, and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it a praise in the earth" (Is. 62:6-7). **The Lord bless this Divine Service.**



St. Paul Preaching to the Romans

We celebrate the Lord's Supper today, in the confession, as Jesus says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread, wine but His very real, true body, blood to eat, drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him, and with one another. According to Scripture, Holy Communion is also a public confession of faith, sharing a unity in doctrinal belief; also those who eat, drink our Lord's body, blood unworthily or without discernment do so to their harm. In love towards God and our neighbor, according to Scripture, the Church has always practiced a closed communion. **Therefore, in love and pastoral concern for guests, if you are not a member of the LCMS and desire to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor first.**
