OLD TESTAMENT Lamentations 3:22–33

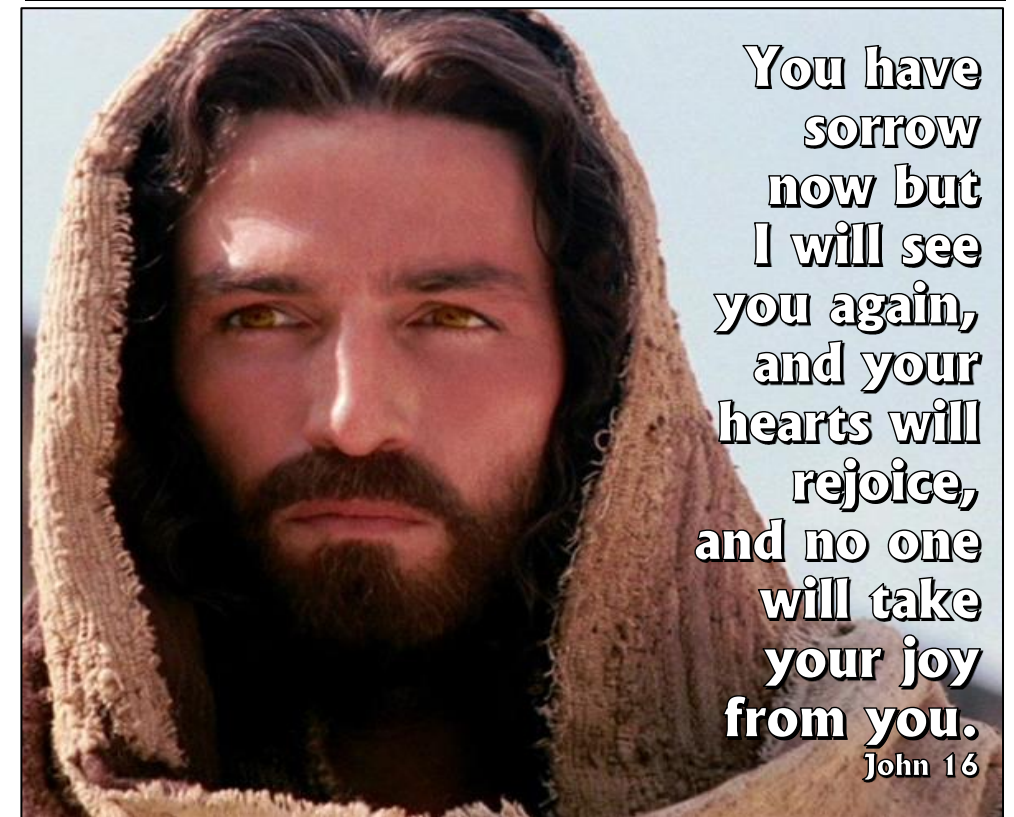
