Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once."

This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, "Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.'

Ad Te Levavi "to you, I have lifted up" from Ps. 25, as we long for His coming.

Welcome to the Lord's House. Jesus Comes in Humility to Redeem Us.

The new Church Year begins throughout the world, by focusing on the humble comings of our Lord. "Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey" (Matt. 21:5). Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a beast of burden to bears the sin of the world. He is hailed as the promised Christ, Savior, the Son of David, to reign forever, riding to His enthronement on the cross, where He shows Himself to be "The LORD is our Righteousness" (Jer. 23:5–6). Our Lord still comes in great humility to deliver His righteousness to us in the Word and Sacraments. Before receiving Christ's body and blood, we also sing, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" As we receive the Sacrament, our hearts set on His return in glory, for "our salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed" (Rom. 13:11). **The Lord bless this Divine Service.**

Advent Season prepares us for the coming of our Lord. Paraments are blue, a color of royalty, as He is our King, also a color of sorrow. This is a penitential season for special devotions and repentance; though not as solemn as during Lent; altar flowers still present; "Alleluia's" are retained; but the "Gloria in Excelsis" is omitted.

We celebrate the Lord's Supper today, in the confession, as Jesus says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread, wine but His very real, true body, blood to eat, drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him, and with one another. According to Scripture, Holy Communion is also a public confession of faith, sharing a unity in doctrinal belief; also those who eat, drink our Lord's body, blood unworthily or without discernment do so to their harm. In love towards God and our neighbor, according to Scripture, the Church has always practiced a closed communion. **Therefore, in love and pastoral concern for our guests, if you are not a member of the LCMS and desire to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor first.**
