Make Advent Penitential Again Pastor Burgdorf

We are weak men. Compare the average Christian today to the Saints of old, and this is clear. Christians have forgotten what it means to stand firm; to fight like our mothers and fathers did; to contend for the faith in a world that is against us. Christians are content in a neutered faith that blows in the wind of any fad and modern teaching. We have lost what it means to be men and women of God. We have become weak through the modern luxuries of the world, and apathetic through our lack of discipline.

It is time to make Advent penitential again. This is what our Fathers knew, and it is what we have lost. Advent is not merely a time of preparation for Christmas, but it is a period of spiritual struggle and fasting. It is a time to prepare for the second coming of Christ. It is, like Lent, a time of penitence—a time to examine our lives, to curb our sin, and to mortify our flesh. A time to open our homes to those around us and invite them into the great mysteries of the faith which Christ has so richly poured out upon us.

The Church has always understood this. From the earliest Christians who fasted and prayed together, to faithful fathers who ordered their households by Scripture and worship, to generations who passed on the catechism to their children — God's people have always known that faith is not formed in moments of comfort, but through patterns of prayer, sacrifice, and hospitality. These practices are not ways of earning God's favor — Christ has already secured that for us on the cross. Rather, they are the gifts God gives to strengthen us in Him. They train us to resist temptation, to crucify our sinful desires, and to live with joy, courage, and hope.

So let us live this way. Let us reclaim Advent, and Lent for that matter, to be what it once was. Let us embrace difficulty and discipline and be molded by it. Let us keep the fast, extend hospitality, and live as Christians.

Several very confessional and faithful men (including a Seminary Professor, Synod VP, District Presidents, even a previous vicar of Risen Savior) are putting together a tool specifically designed for men to aid us in remembering what the Church has forgotten; to encourage and keep us accountable to ourselves and one another as we engage in spiritual disciplines.



Advent (& Lent) Disciplines Pastor Weinkauf

Our Lord says, "when you fast..., when you pray..., when you give..." Not 'if' but "when." Of course neither Lutherans nor Scripture teach that we earn rewards, special favors, or atone for sins by doing so - as Roman Catholics teach. Our Lord encourages our behavior and fasting and praying as to benefit our mind and bodies to be discipline and trained in positive ways as we receive His Word, His Sacramental gifts, and creational gifts. This can strengthen spiritual life, thus drawing closer to God, growing in virtue, practicing self-control, and reprioritizing our life. Scripture has rhythm of Fasting before Feasting. This happens throughout the year but takes special focus during the penitential seasons (Advent/Lent) before the great feasts of

Behavior

- Advent Wreath/Calendar. The ancient practice of lighting the wreath each night with a devotional.

Christmas and Easter. Here are some practical measures:

- Utilize daily devotions or add another one.
- Add daily Matins, Vespers, Compline, and/or Evening Prayer Service from the hymnal to your routine.
- During your work lunch hour, add Bible reading.
- Add a time (or additional time) in the day for Bible reading.
- Add a physical workout in home or gym (and select a Lutheran podcast to listen during the activity.)
- Take stairs instead of elevators.
- Invite someone from church or a neighbor to come over to eat.
- Volunteer!
- No screens after dinner; no TV during the day; cutback screentime
- Set morning alarm 1 hour earlier for reading, workout.
- Making special gifts, save money from abstaining from things
- Avoid eating out, or cut out certain times you eat out.
- Avoid snacking or certain type of snacks at certain times of day.

Fasting Ideas

- Eliminate 1 meal a day.
- No desserts or treats.
- No alcohol or caffeine.
- No meat on Mon., Wed., Fri.
- No hot water, take cold showers. No soft drinks.
- No food during daylight.
- No food during certain hours.




