## *A Reflection from Deacon Allan Frederiksen*

Keeping Holy the Sabbath Day.

As we have now entered the “eating season” with Thanksgiving Day just yesterday (as of this writing), we also enter a new Liturgical Year, Year C, beginning with the Season of Advent, while the Feast of Christ the King was celebrated last Sunday.

The keyword(s) being “Christ the King.”

We ended last month’s reflection with the words “We will look at the worship space itself.”

There are two parts to the worship space; the institutional space to which we go on weekdays, Sundays, and days of obligation. This is the space with the altar, the tabernacle, the pews, the ambo, the statues, the stained-glass windows, the choir, the noisy children, ..., and we can add to the list at our hearts desire.

The other space is more personal, because it is in our hearts and minds, it is the temple of the Holy Spirit, and as a result it may be more important than the institutional space, because it is from here, deep inside ourselves, we participate in worship.

When we come to Mass, do we do so with joy in our hearts? Or do we do it because it is an obligation, and it is, we must suffer through for about one hour on Sundays and days of obligation, perhaps only 30 minutes at weekday Masses, and God help us, two or more hours at the Easter Vigil?

Since Advent is, in the original sense, a penitential season just as is Lent, perhaps we need to do some serious internal reflection on our motives. Advent comes from the Latin word *Adventus* or *Ad venire*, meaning the coming, the arrival, something anticipated.

We usually associate this with the celebration of the birth of Christ, and it is not incorrect, but it is deeper. In fact, we can speak of the Three Comings of the of the Lord, and they will all be heard in the readings on the First Sunday of Lent in Year C; from the Prophet Jeremiah we hear of the coming of Jesus, “In those days, in

that time, I will raise up for David a just shoot, he shall do what is right and just in the land.”

That is the coming of Jesus in Bethlehem, an event that took place some 2000 years ago. We may call this the first coming.

The Gospel speaks in the terms of the end of the world, and we refer to this as the Second Coming of Christ, at the end of time, “and then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.”

There is a third coming which forms an important link between the first and second comings, and it is spoken about in the second reading – the Welcoming of Christ into our own lives, here and now.

The first coming is in the past, the second is in the future, it is anticipated (advent – ad venire). We participate in the celebration of those comings in the official liturgy of the church, as much as we avail ourselves to the liturgy. That is in the institutional space.

The third coming is entirely interior to ourselves – how open are we to the works of the Holy Spirit and to God’s Grace?

Have a most Joyful Christmas and a Blessed New Year.

## ***PURPOSE OF THE COLOR CORPS OF THE FOURTH DEGREE***

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to encourage active Catholic citizenship and foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large. The Color Corps members exemplify all the principles of our Order;

**Charity-** by the gift of their time and energies necessary to practice, perfect and perform the ceremonials and sword drill:

**Unity-** by the united efforts of Sir Knights to practice and perfect a coordinated drill for the good of the Church and the Order;

**Fraternity-** by expressing an “Esprit de Corps,” sharing a common desire for drill excellence and camaraderie, and

**Patriotism-** by performing precision drill as a salute to God and to the country and visually exhibiting a love for both.

## ***COLOR CORPS DESCRIPTION***

The **Color Corps (C.C.)** has two sub-groups, the **Color Guard (C.G.)** and the **Honor Guard (H.G.)**. The Color Guard consists of the flag bearers and at least two members of the Honor Guard who escorts the colors. The Honor Guard consists of members of the Color Corps who have mastered the Manual of the Sword.

In many assemblies, all members of the Color Corps belong to the Honor Guard. This should be kept in mind when following the procedures in the Color Corps Manual.

The public appearance of Fourth Degree knights as a Color Corps at religious and civic functions is an important activity for each assembly. They add dignity and the pride of Church and country to any event. By these public demonstrations their loyalties bring credit to themselves and to the Knights of Columbus.
