



"Having just spent 5 great weeks in the country of my birth and growing up years, a country I have only visited 4 times since October of 1963. What struck me was the tremendous number of churches, primarily Evangelical Lutheran, but a few, very few other denominations, and just 40 Roman Catholic churches, 38 in Denmark proper, as well as one on the Faroe Islands and one on Greenland.

According to the sources I found there are more than 6,700 churches in cities, towns, and villages, or about 1 church for every 895 persons based on the latest population figures.

In view of the mandate to keep the Sabbath Day Holy, attending church for a Roman Catholic, if one does not live in a city, is a bit problematic. During considerable research before traveling, we found a total of 4 RC churches within reasonable distance of where we were going and visiting. The first was the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Denmark, the largest diocese in the world, but probably the one with the smallest number of churches. This diocese includes all of Denmark, Faroe Island and Greenland.



All the masses were celebrated in Danish. In the Cathedral Church, Sankt Ansgar's Parish, the presiding priest was Italian and most of the worshippers were tourists, perhaps 30 people total.

The second Sunday we attended Mass at Sankt Paulus II parish in the small town of Stuer. The priest was Polish, and the worshippers were Vietnamese, Sri Lankan, Polish, one or two Danes, and people from other cultures. This parish is supported financially by The German Catholic Church. The number of attendees were less than 20.

The third Sunday we attended Mass at Sankt Knud's Parish in the city of Svendborg. Here the priest was Vietnamese, a great number of the worshippers were Vietnamese, but also Sri Lankan, Filipino, Polish, West African and perhaps a handful of Danes. I estimated that perhaps 40 people attended Mass.

The fourth and fifth Sunday we had to drive quite some distance to Sankt Knud's parish in the city of Naestved. Here the priest as Italian, and the worshippers were again Vietnamese, Sri Lankan, Indians from the Goa region, a few Filipinos, a few West Africans, and a few Danes. Here, on the last Sunday we were in the country, there were probably 50 or so people attending Mass.

The Evangelical Lutheran Churches are basically museum pieces, being well maintained, and many date back to what in Denmark is called "prior to the reformation," some more than 900 years old, but most are from the 12 and 13 hundreds.

Occasionally there will be a worship service in one of them, but most of the time they are used for concerts. Most Danes attend church to have a child baptized, to have a child confirmed, to be married, and to have a funeral service.

What has led to the decline in Church attendance? The answers are varied, but can perhaps be summed up with one word, complacency, as well as an extremely high standard of living coupled with a system of social services that provides "cradle to grave" care for those in need.

Good of the Order

We remember and pray for all the Sir Knights of our Assembly who have gone before us. As Pope Francis said, remembering our deceased enables us "to have a truly realistic vision of the lives they lived, to understand the meaning and the value of the good they accomplished, their strength, their commitment and their generous and unselfish love." Praying for the dead also helps us "to understand the meaning of a life that aspires not to an earthly homeland, but to a better, heavenly homeland.

LET US KEEP all our Sir Knights and families in our prayers. Our prayers give them hope and peace. Please pray for an end to abortion, for our nation, for persecuted Christians all around the world, and for families to stay together.

PRAY FOR all who have left our faith and those who are considering leaving. Let us also pray for our Priests and clergy that they may have an abundance of attendance at their respective parishes.

LET US REMEMBER all those who left before us. May all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Continue to pray for all our Brother Sir Knights and their families who are in need of our prayers.

PLEASE PRAY FOR the women who are contemplating to have an abortion. Pray for an end to abortion.

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to encourage active Catholic citizenship and foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large. The Color Corps members exemplify all the principles of our Order;

Charity- by the gift of their time and energies necessary to practice, perfect and perform the ceremonials and sword drill:

Unity- by the united efforts of Sir Knights to practice and perfect a coordinated drill for the good of the Church and the Order;

Fraternity- by expressing an "Esprit de Corps," sharing a common desire for drill excellence and camaraderie, and

Patriotism- by performing precision drill as a salute to God and to the country and visually exhibiting a love for both.

COLOR CORPS DESCRIPTION

The Color Corps (C.C.) has two sub-groups, the Color Guard (C.G.) and the Honor Guard (H.G.). The Color Guard consists of the flag bearers and at least two members of the Honor Guard who escorts the colors. The Honor Guard consists of members of the Color Corps who have mastered the Manual of the Sword.

In many assemblies, all members of the Color Corps belong to the Honor Guard. This should be kept in mind when following the procedures in the Color Corps Manual.

The public appearance of Fourth Degree knights as a Color Corps at religious and civic functions is an important activity for each assembly. They add dignity and the pride of Church and country to any event. By these public demonstrations their loyalties bring credit to themselves and to the Knights of Columbus.
