## A Message from Faithful Navigator Joseph Chien

The southern arm of the **National Eucharistic Pilgrimage** that departed from the tip of Texas in Brownsville is winding around the southeastern region of the United States on its way to Indianapolis for the 10th National Eucharistic Congress. The Eucharistic Pilgrimage is passing through the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston from May 30-June 2 with stops at St. Laurence Catholic Church in Sugar Land, St. Benedict the Abbot Catholic Church in Houston, Cathedral of Our Lady of Walsingham, University of St. Thomas, and St. Mary Cathedral Basilica in Galveston. As part of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, His Eminence Daniel Cardinal DiNardo will celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi on Sunday, June 2 at 10 AM, at St. Mary Cathedral Basilica in Galveston. Following the Mass, there will be a Eucharistic procession from St. Mary Cathedral Basilica to Sacred Heart Catholic Church (Holy Family Parish).

During the month of May, our Sir Knights participated in two District turnouts and one local turnout. We served as Fourth Degree Honor Guard at the Transitional Diaconate Ordination Mass celebrated by His Eminence Daniel Cardinal DiNardo on May 11 at Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart-Downtown Houston. We took part in Council 8960 Corporate Communion on May 19 at St. Helen Catholic Church. We participated as Honor Guard at the Baccalaureate Mass celebrating the Class of 2024 of Cristo Rey Jesuit College Preparatory School of Houston at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart on May 30. Thank you Sir Knights for the service and dedication!

We held elections for 2084 officers for the Fraternal Year 2024-2025 at the Assembly meeting on May 2, in accordance with the provisions in Article VIII, Section 23 of *Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus*. Former District Master SK Ken Oradiegwu, FDM, PFN presided over the elections. A roster of officers for the next fraternal year is shown below in *Assembly Officers for Fraternal Year 2024-2025*.

Fr. Trey Crespo has resigned as the Faithful Friar. In keeping with the *Laws and Rules*, members approved to establish a special committee, consisting of the Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Admiral and Faithful Pilot, to search and

appoint a priest as our new Faithful Friar. Meanwhile, Deacon Allan has graciously agreed to fill in as Acting Faithful Friar. Deacon Allan has served as acting Faithful Friar for much of this Fraternal year, providing spiritual guidance, leading prayers, giving catechesis and spiritual talks, and writing a monthly column in the newsletter. Thank you Deacon Allan.

The **2024 Summer Fourth Degree Exemplification** will be held on June 22, 2024 at Sts. Simon and Jude Catholic Church in The Woodlands. Any Third Degree member of our Councils who wishes to become a Fourth Degree Sir Knight at the Summer Exemplification is required to complete the Fourth Degree Membership Document (Form-4) and Candidate Registration for Exemplification. Completed Form-4 must be submitted to the Assembly by June 6 for membership approval at the upcoming Assembly meeting.

SK Ron Boyce, Fourth Degree Director of Programs from the Supreme, initiated the Korean and Vietnam War Census Program. The Fourth Degree will conduct a census of the membership to establish a record of service in both the Korean and Vietnam Wars. This program "will schedule a Memorial Mass in the spring of 2025, in one of the jurisdictions cathedrals or basilicas to mark the 50th Anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War...Certificates recognizing service will be delivered to surviving veterans via their Councils... It is recommended that Faithful Navigators collaborate with their local Grand Knights to hold a party or dinner for those veterans receiving the certificate. There should also be a Fourth Degree Honor Guard present during the certificate presentation." It was discussed and agreed at the Assembly meeting that each of our Councils will appoint a program director for this census program. The program directors will work with the Assembly to conduct the census and plan recognition activities. Let us identify these brave men that served in these conflicts in our Councils and show our appreciation to those veterans and let them know that their sacrifices are not forgotten. We are Fourth Degree Sir Knights of the Knights of Columbus. Let us be faithful to our Order, Church and Country. I would like to encourage all of our Sir Knights to become active members of the Color Corps and serve as the visible arm of our Order.

## A Reflection from Deacon Allan Frederiksen

From time to time, it is necessary to come clean, so I will do that first.

Part of what follows was written by Deacon Frank (last name not known) in the May 10<sup>th</sup> issue of the **Catholic Exchange**, so all credit must go to him. It is shown in *italics*.

His piece is titled "*The Cup We Share*" and it is a study of the relationship between the Old Covenant (The Passover Covenant) and the New Covenant, and it focuses on the meal.

The ritual had four parts to it and each part had in common prayer, hymns, blessings and a cup of wine mixed with a little water which was consumed by every participant at the conclusion of each part.

Each of the four cups had a name. The first was called the Cup of Sanctification; the second cup was called the Cup of Proclamation; the third the Cup of Blessing; and the fourth the Cup of Praise.

From St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 10:16-17), we can learn a great number of things. It was during the third cup that Jesus instituted the Eucharist because we read: "The cup of Blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf."

Just a little something for us to contemplate for the next month, the richness of the Celebration of the Eucharist.

## Korean & Vietnam War Census Program

The Fourth Degree will conduct a census of the membership to establish a record of service in both the Korean and Vietnam Wars

During both World Wars, the Order documented war service by its members in the archives at the Blessed Michael J. McGivney Pilgrimage Center. However, similar efforts were not conducted following either the Korean or Vietnam Wars.

The Korean War commenced in 1950, making the approximate minimum age of surviving veterans ninety-one years old. The approximate minimum age of surviving Vietnam veterans serving from 1965-1973 is 69-77 years old. Both the Korean and Vietnam Wars marked a significant departure in how troops served and returned from war, as service was no longer for the duration. Gone were the hero's welcome on return. Vietnam veterans returned to a hostile and divided nation, where they were either overlooked or criticized for their service.

Assemblies working in conjunction with their assigned councils will conduct a census of their membership using the attached form. Where possible, documented service of deceased members needs to be recorded. Inclusion in the census shall be limited to veterans meeting the requirements established by Congress for the Korean Service Medal you must have served from June 25, 1950 to July 27, 1953, and have been on permanent assignment or on temporary duty for 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days and performed his duty within the country of Korea. For the Vietnam Service Medals, you must of served from July 3 1965 to March 28 1973 and have been on temporary duty for at least 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days or have served in combat with a unit directly supporting a military operation in Southeast Asia (Vietnam and the contiguous waters and airspace in Thailand, Laos, or Cambodia; or the airspace thereof and in the direct support of military operations in Vietnam.

This project would be an excellent opportunity for all the District Masters to collaborate with the State Deputy to schedule a Memorial Mass in the spring of 2025, in one of the jurisdictions cathedrals or basilicas to mark the 50th Anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War. In planning the event, jurisdictions should consider how to invite all Brother Knights who are Korean or Vietnam War veterans.

The Mass could be followed by the placing of a wreath at a local Korean or Vietnam War Memorial by the jurisdiction's State Deputy, State Officers, Vice Supreme Master, District Master, and Past State Deputies with the escort of a Fourth Degree Honor Guard. For all assemblies who cannot participate at your local basilica or cathedral, they should collaborate with their councils to have a local Mass, or Masses during the spring of 2025.

Certificates recognizing service will be delivered to surviving veterans via their councils. For District Masters, it is recommended that you reach out to all your Faithful Navigators to collaborate with their local Grand Knights to hold a party or dinner for those veterans receiving the certificate. There should also be a Fourth Degree Honor Guard present during the certificate presentation. Let us show our appreciation to those veterans in our council who served in these two wars and to let them know that their sacrifices are not forgotten.

Article VIII, Section 23 of the *Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus* states:

Annually, each assembly shall elect a Faithful Navigator, a Faithful Captain, a Faithful Pilot, a Faithful Comptroller, a Faithful Scribe, a Faithful Purser, Faithful Inner and Outer Sentinels, a Faithful Admiral and a three-year Trustee. The Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Admiral and Faithful Pilot shall annually appoint a priest to act as Faithful Friar or Chaplain but such selection must be made in accordance with any rules established by the bishop of the diocese in which the assembly is located. The Faithful Admiral shall be chosen from the Past Faithful Navigators of the assembly, if any there be.

The regular election of officers in Assemblies shall take place annually at the first regular business meeting of the assembly held in May of each year. The officers then elected all hold office for the term of one year except the faithful trustees whose election is for a three-year term and until their successors are elected and qualified. Such officers shall take office, with or without installation, at the first regular meeting of each assembly in July following their election.

#### **CANDIDATE INFORMATION**

Candidates must be Third Degree members in good standing with the Knights of Columbus.

The Exemplification fee is \$70.00. The candidate will receive an initiation package which includes the initiation fee, registration fee, Social Baldric, Fourth Degree lapel pin and a Saturday banquet ticket. The exemplification fee for a priest, deacon or seminarian is \$30.00.

The candidate may purchase the optional sword package for an additional \$300.00 which includes an etched sword, scabbard, carrying case and service baldric.

Candidate "no-shows" without a six (6) day advance notice to the District Master will be assessed \$40.00 for his exemplification fee. Priests are exempt from this assessment.

The approved Dress for the Fourth Degree Candidates are described below. There are three options available to them:

1) A dark business suit (black, gray, or navy) with a plain white shirt (no button-down collar), dark subdued long necktie, black belt, dark socks, and black plain toe shoes (no boots).

2) The new uniform of the Fourth Degree. This is available online at

https://www.kofcuniform.com/CustomPage/OrderNow

The uniform package includes the official tie of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. This must be worn with a plain white shirt (no button-down collar), black belt, dark socks, and black plain toe shoes (no boots).

**3)** A black tuxedo with a plain white shirt (no wing-type or button-down collar), dark subdued long necktie, dark socks, and black plain toe shoes (no boots).

Priests and Transitional Deacons should wear clerical attire.

Candidates currently on <u>active</u> military duty may wear their Class A dress uniform.

Candidates will not be allowed to participate in the exemplification without the above-mentioned proper dress. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.

Exemplification Banquet – Candidates are guests of the District Master and will receive one Saturday banquet ticket if noted on the registration form. Candidates must purchase additional banquet tickets for their family and guests in advance through his new Assembly. Tickets will be distributed when you arrive at the exemplification venue for registration.

Meal tickets for all Sir Knights, their families and guests must be purchased in advance through the Assembly Comptroller.

#### **COLOR GUARD**

We encourage all Sir Knights to join our Color Guard. This core group represents the First District of Texas and is very dedicated. If you are able and willing, it is a very rewarding experience. SK Teddy Cuaping is a great Commander of the Color Guard.

#### PURPOSE OF THE COLOR CORPS OF THE FOURTH DEGREE

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to encourage active Catholic citizenship and foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large. The Color Corps members exemplify all the principles of our Order;

**Charity-** by the gift of their time and energies necessary to practice, perfect and perform the ceremonials and sword drill:

**Unity-** by the united efforts of Sir Knights to practice and perfect a coordinated drill for the good of the Church and the Order;

**Fraternity**- by expressing an "Esprit de Corps," sharing a common desire for drill excellence and camaraderie, and

**Patriotism-** by performing precision drill as a salute to God and to the country and visually exhibiting a love for both.

#### **COLOR CORPS DESCRIPTION**

The Color Corps (C.C.) has two sub-groups, the Color Guard (C.G.) and the Honor Guard (H.G.). The Color Guard consists of the flag bearers and at least two members of the Honor Guard who escorts the colors. The Honor Guard consists of members of the Color Corps who have mastered the Manual of the Sword.

In many assemblies, all members of the Color Corps belong to the Honor Guard. This should be kept in mind when following the procedures in the Color Corps Manual.

The public appearance of Fourth Degree knights as a Color Corps at religious and civic functions is an important activity for each assembly. They add dignity and the pride of Church and country to any event. By these public demonstrations their loyalties bring credit to themselves and to the Knights of Columbus.
