- Call to Order- Meeting was called to order at 6:06 pm by Cary Krueger. All stood for the pledge.
- Secretary's Report Presented by Mikelle Betanzos
  - September 2022 minutes approved. Courtney Cannon made motion to approve minutes to file and audit.
- Treasurer's Report Presented by Courtney Cannon
  - o Funds received this month include Book Fair and \$5955 was remitted to the school where 75% will go to the media center and 25% to the book room; an additional 2 business partners (The Browne Business and Forte Promotional Marketing); cash/check donations for the One Track Mind fundraiser (online donations still forthcoming-site closes to donations on November 11<sup>th</sup>), final profit from the sale of School Supply kits and the sale of 259 tickets for the Fall festival
  - o Funds out include fall festival expenditures, general operating expenses and the purchase of Holiday gift cards for teachers

## Old Business

- o Business Partners
  - Planet Smoothie 10/20 Spirit night took place from 12-7
  - November cash for quotes- families can call the Glover Agency (Allstate Insurance) to request a quote for car, auto, etc and Mr. Glover will donate \$10 per quote
  - Code Ninjas PNO will be Friday 11/11 from 7-9pm; cost is \$29 per child and parents can register with Code Ninjas who will donate a percentage back to the PTA
- o Spirit wear-all pre-ordered Spirit Wear items arrived and were distributed; additional spirit items have been ordered and will be for sale at the Fall Festival

   They will have t-shirts for sale; they are discussing the idea of doing a High Five Friday at morning carpool in an effort to increase the presence of dads at school
- o Hospitality
  - Bus Driver appreciation recap-one of the dads on duty co-chairs worked with CFA who kindly donated chicken biscuits and coffee for the bus drivers
  - Teacher lunch 10/20-the hospitality committee provided pizza, chips and a drink to each staff member (using in kind credits from Papa Johns)
- o Student Enrichment Fund
  - Class shirts-all shirts ordered as part of SEF have been received and distributed for use at field day and school spirit days/events
- o Fundraiser ("One Track Mind")
  - Total rasied-33K, 60% of the amount needed to fund the track
  - Fund Hub is open for online donations through November 11<sup>th</sup> and prizes are still being awarded for donations that come in through that date
  - The executive committee is exploring options to reach the goal of 55K
- o Membership
