



Account Indebtedness – Prior NSF Checks:

Any Exhibitor who fails to settle his indebtedness to this show is barred from taking part whatsoever in any USEF Recognized Show until settlement is made per GR 913. **Any presenter of an NSF check to Region 9 AHA in 2022 or 2023 must submit a money order, cashier's check, credit card or cash as payment with the 2024 entries.** A charge of \$25.00 will be applied to all returned checks for this show. **NO POST-DATED CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED, ALL CHECKS MUST BE CLOSED AT TIME ENTRY IS PROCESSED – NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Awards:

A full Top Five will be awarded in Region 9 Championship classes regardless of the number of entries in a class. However, only horses in the top 50% of the class [rounded up and not to exceed 5 awards] will receive Arabian Breeders Sweepstakes [ABS] Allocated Prize Money, [per the rules of the specific program].

Champions will receive a Championship Trophy and a Top 5 ribbon. Reserve Champions will receive a Reserve Plaque and a Top 5 ribbon. The remainder of the Top 5 horses will receive a Top 5 plaque and a Top 5 ribbon. Per AHA SWP 117.4, Sweepstakes neck ribbons will be awarded in Sweepstakes Allocated Prize Money classes, designated with **\$\$\$=A**, according to the 50% rule.

Please Note: All awards not claimed by the close of the awards room on the last day of classes, will be forfeited. Awards will not be mailed to exhibitors after the event.

EXCEPTIONS:

Lead line class 121: Special Lead line prizes will be awarded.

AHA Yearling Sweepstakes classes 3, 4, 37 and 38: An AHA ABS Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded. Additional Rules & Regulations for Dressage Only:

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. English Dressage using 2023 test, Western Dressage using 2022 test. Rider must use approved helmet on all days including the move-in day. Whips are prohibited in dressage classes. Dressage ride times and sport horse schedule will be posted at <http://region9aha.org>

Businesses/Vendors:

Any person or entity providing services on the show grounds must check in at the show office and will be charged a vendor fee, whether setting up business in the trade fair area or any other area of the show. All fund raising activities on the Will Rogers Memorial Coliseum show grounds must have prior approval from the Region 9 Show Committee.

Cancellation of Classes due to Emergencies:

If a class, or a series of classes, or all or part of the competition is cancelled due to an accident, storm, or other emergency after the start of the show [defined as initial Move-In Day], no refund of entry fees will be made.

Class Splits:

The Show Committee reserves the right to split classes at the discretion of show management that have become too large to be executed in a safe manner for exhibitors and horses. If any classes are split, they will be divided and will run in the originally scheduled session.

Conduct of Show Participants:

This show shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of the United States Equestrian Federation [USEF], the Arabian Horse Association, and the United States Dressage Federation [USDF] where applicable. The official rulebooks of each of these organizations will prevail for this show; any changes or corrections of these rules automatically become part of this book. Each participant in the show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the USEF, AHA, and USDF rules. Questions not covered by USEF, AHA, and USDF rules shall be decided by Show Management.

In accordance with USEF GR838.5 Cruelty to and Abuse of a Horse:

Any action(s) against a horse by a competitor or an exhibitor, which are deemed excessive by a Federation judge, Federation steward, technical delegate or competition veterinarian, in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination which may be deemed appropriate by the Show Committee. Such action(s) could include but are not limited to excessive use of the whip or spurs.

Dogs: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash attached to a human or otherwise contained. Please pick up and clean up after your dog's potty break. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Loose dogs will be impounded. NO dogs are allowed in the air-conditioned areas of Watt Arena, John Justin Arena, Brown-Lupton Commercial Exhibit Hall, or Will Rogers Coliseum. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7 of USEF General Rules as well as issuance of warning cards.

Electrical Policy:

Per the National Electrical Code, if extension cords are used at WRMC, Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI) Protection is required. These cords have a test and a reset button and have the words "GFCI protected" printed on the cord. All 120 volt extension cords shall be three-wire grounding type cords (recognized by the 3-prong plug). Extension cords may not be placed through doorways. Frayed or damaged cords may not be used. ***THIS CODE WILL BE ENFORCED.***

Fire Safety:

By order of the Fort Worth Fire Department, fire extinguishers must remain UNCOVERED with easy access. No flammable materials, such as bunting, tissue paper, crepe paper, etc., will be permitted to be used for decorations and all materials used for decorative purposes must be treated with flame-proofing and approved by the City of Fort Worth Fire Department. Exhibitors shall not operate or place any engine or motor or machinery on the premises or use oils, burning fluids, kerosene, naphtha, or gasoline or any other flammable chemical for either mechanical or other purposes or any other agent other than electricity for illuminating the premises without the written consent of the Fire Marshall.

AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS: All horses entered in any AHA Regional Show shall be owned by a competing member of AHA. This rule does include Junior Exhibitor owners. Any trainer, rider, driver, or halter handler who exhibits horses in the ring or signs the entry form as the responsible person for an individual's horses at the show must have a Competition Level Membership in AHA. **An AHA Competition Card and membership in AHA and Regional qualifications [review the updated guidelines in the 2024 AHA Handbook] are required for Regional Championship classes; Single Event Memberships are not allowed. We encourage you to join one of the local clubs found in the front of this prize list prior to the show.**

USEF AMATEUR MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS: Every rider or driver having reached his 19th birthday prior to December 1, 2023 must have in his possession a USEF Amateur card or apply for a USEF Membership and Amateur card on the USEF Website at least one hour prior to riding in an Amateur to Ride/Handle Class. If a non-member wishes to participate in a class restricted to amateurs, it is required that he or she join USEF as a \$80 Competing Senior Active member, which includes amateur certification, and sign as an amateur.

The Amateur Non-Member Fee has been eliminated; USEF membership is required for all Amateurs.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

UPDATED USEF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS IMPORTANT Extraordinary Rule Change to GR 202.1 Effective 12.01.2022: Nonmember participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees and agents **MUST** pay a show pass fee. **COMPETITIONS CANNOT ACCEPT PAYMENT FOR A SHOW PASS FEE FROM EXHIBITORS. SHOW PASS FEES CAN ONLY BE MADE ONLINE ON THE USEF WEB SITE BY EXHIBITORS.** Nonmembers in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than 1 (one) show pass per competition year.

To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors **MUST** be Senior Members in good standing. Safe Sport Requirements—Safe Sport Training must be completed prior to the first day of competition.

Western Dressage Association of America Membership Requirements:

As of December 1, 2021, all riders, owners, and trainers at USEF-licensed Regular and Local shows must be members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee at the show.

IMPORTANT! New USEF Rule Effective January 1, 2019

The US Equestrian Federation (USEF) announced a rule change on Tuesday, August 28, 2018, requiring that, effective January 1, 2019, all USEF members 18 and over with an Adult Competing Membership must complete Safe Sport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Below is from the USEF website; "As of **Jan 1, 2019** every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) with a Competing Membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training. A 30 day grace period to complete the Safe Sport Training will be provided to all members who renew or join on or after December 1, 2019. If you are a USEF competing member 18 years of age or older you are required to complete the core Safe Sport Training with 30 days of activating your membership. If you do not complete the training, you are ineligible to participate in all USEF activities including competitions.

Below is the USEF General Rule regarding SafeSport and the SafeSport Training requirement. GR1303 Safe Sport Requirements

Consistent with the mission statement of the Federation, the welfare of equestrian participants, especially minors, is of paramount concern. When any member -- athlete, participant, trainer, coach, organizer, official, volunteer, or staff member -- is subjected to or engages in abuse or misconduct, it undermines the mission of the Federation and is inconsistent with the best interests of equestrian sport and of the athletes the Federation serves. The Safe Sport Policy and U.S. Center for Safe Sport's Code have been created to protect all athletes from misconduct they may experience within sport. The education and training of all participants in equestrian sport is crucial to the protection of athletes, reporting of misconduct, and eradication of abuse in our sport.

The U.S. Center for SafeSport (Center) is the first and only national organization of its kind focused on ending all forms of abuse in sport. As an independent non-profit headquartered in Denver, CO, the Center provides consultation to sport entities on prevention techniques and policies, while developing best practices and educational programs focused on promoting athlete wellbeing and putting an end to abuse in sports. The Center also provides a safe, professional, and confidential place for individuals to report sexual abuse.

The Federation Safe Sport Policy defines a "Federation Participant" as any Federation member, or non-member, who participates in or attends a Federation Licensed Competition or sanctioned event. The Federation's Safe Sport Policy can be found at www.usef.org and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code can be found at www.safesport.org

A. Every Federation member and Federation Participant shall abide by the Federation's Safe Sport Policy and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, which can be found at www.usef.org and www.safesport.org respectively.

B. In order to comply with S. 534, the Protecting Young Victim's from Sexual Abuse and Safe Sport Authorization Act of 2017, the Federation Safe Sport Policy, and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, every Federation adult member and Federation adult Participant, with the exception of the victim, shall report suspected sexual misconduct, including sexual abuse, and suspected child abuse, within 24 hours to the appropriate authorities and to the U.S. Center for SafeSport.

C. Beginning January 1, 2019, every Federation adult member (18 years of age and over) with a "Competing Membership" shall complete Federation-approved Safe Sport Training in accordance with the U.S. Center for SafeSport's Education & Training Policies.

Motorized Vehicle Use:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Non-Official Farriers / Veterinarians:

Non-official farriers or veterinarians may practice at this show if they check in at the show office and pay the vendor fee. Farriers or veterinarians that seek to conduct business at this show may be bound by the rules of USEF and AHA, thus making them accountable to USEF and AHA. Subjecting farriers to the authority of USEF's Hearing Committee or the AHA Ethical Practice Review Board permits USEF and AHA to sanction such individuals, if appropriate.

Parking at WRMC:

It is best if exhibitors come in on University to Trail Drive and enter at Big Arch gate #42.

There is a daily parking fee for all parking at Will Rogers Memorial Center, for both vehicles and trailers. Vehicle parking is \$6/day for a multi-day pass to hang on your rear view mirror. Single day parking pass is \$12. Trailer parking is \$6/day located south of Dickies Garage, gate #50. You can request a temporary pass to load/unload at the Attendant Booth, but then must purchase a parking pass for both vehicle and trailer if you plan to park.

There will be Parking Passes available in the Show Office – Each Owner will receive 1 (one) 5 day Parking Pass that is valid from Tuesday May 28 – Saturday June 1.

Vehicles and trailers found without the proper parking passes will be ticketed by the City of Fort Worth.

Responsibility:

All entries are accepted with the understanding that neither Region 9 AHA, nor the Will Rogers Memorial Center and the City of Fort Worth will be responsible for any loss, personal injury or damage to horses exhibited or for any article of any kind or any nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the respective Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor who will be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury of any person, animal or property occasioned by him or his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify Region 9 AHA and the Will Rogers Equestrian Center and the City of Fort Worth against any and all legal costs, including attorney fees which may be the result thereof. The submitting of any entry form to the respective Show Secretary shall constitute an acceptance of the provisions herein set forth.

Sharps Containers:

Sharps containers will be placed for every fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. These containers when full will be disposed of properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Stabling:

Stalls in the Coliseum and John Justin arena Buildings are permanent Metal 10 X 10 stalls with Swing Doors, Stalls located in the Moncrief Building are portable 10 x 10 stalls with doors. Stalls will be available for Regular Move-in on Sunday May 25, 2024 at 8:00 am. Early Arrival is allowed beginning on Saturday May 24, 2024 with prior approval of the Barn Manager (Edythe Snowden), there is a fee of \$35.00 per stall per day. Shavings are available for purchase from the City of Fort Worth, No Outside Shavings are allowed to be brought into the facility. To promote safety and ready access for emergency personnel and equipment, all aisle ways shall remain clear. All tack, feed and hay shall be stored in your stalls. This will be enforced by Show Management.

Longeing:

Areas for longeing are the Show Arena [beside Cattle Barn #3], Covered Arena in the parking lot by John Justin Arena and the Multipurpose Arena when not in use by the Show. **NO LONGEING WILL BE ALLOWED AT ANY TIME IN THE WARMUP AREA OUTSIDE OF THE IN-GATE OF WILL ROGERS COLISEUM OR IN THE WILL ROGERS COLISEUM, THERE WILL BE NO LONGEING IN JOHN JUSTIN OR WATT ARENA.**

Entry and Post Entry Information:**Entries:**

All entries must be made on the official entry blank for the respective show. A horse must be entered in the name of the registered owner(s) only and must be entered under its full registered name. No horse may be entered on more than one entry form. All entries must include a photocopy of the registration papers. Entries received without these copies will be subject to Incomplete Entry Fees. NOTE: Horses will be listed in classes in the owner's name(s) as recorded on the registration papers. If a horse is being leased or purchased on a sales contract, the lessee or new owner may have their name listed as owner if proper documentation is provided to the Show Secretary. In AOTR classes, leased horses MAY NOT BE SHOWN BY THE LESSEE unless the lessee and lessor are members of the immediate family. No farm names will be listed unless the farm is the recorded owner of the horse – NO EXCEPTIONS! Copies of current AHA, USEF, USDF and WDAA (if applicable) cards must also be included with the entry. An open check will be required in the show office when picking up exhibitor packets. **DO NOT** send open checks or postdated checks. Entry confirmation will be emailed to the Owner and trainer unless otherwise indicated. Because of the volume of entries, receipt of entries cannot be verified by email, phone or fax, therefore it is advisable to send entries via a method which has tracking. Emailed entries and/or documents will not be acknowledged until the official confirmations are sent out. The preferred means for receiving entries is through the mail. However, in the event you need to provide documents electronically, you can send them to the Show Secretary , pliarakos9868@gmail.com. An Incomplete Entry Fee of \$25 will be charged for any required documents, (membership cards, proof of safe sport training, registration papers, qualifications) not submitted with entries.

Entries close Monday, May 6, 2024. Any entries received having a postmark after May 6, 2024 will be charged a post entry fee unless qualified for the 1st time after the close of entries and before May 22nd , **All entries not received by the show secretary, must have proof of mailing or you will be charged a post entry fee.** All entries must be completed on the official entry form for this show and have attached **a valid check, money order or the Credit Card confirmation receipt listing the owner's and horse's name on the receipt for the total amount of appropriate fees (if paying for multiple horses, list amount for each owner/horse.**

Entries received without payment will not be accepted. **No post-dated checks will be accepted.**

A horse must be entered under the legal name of the owner; no horse may be entered on more than one entry form. **A copy of the front and back of all appropriate horse registration papers must accompany the entry.** If registration papers do not reflect current legal owner, additional paperwork is required such as a sales contract. **Horses without registration papers reflecting current legal owner may not be shown in Amateur Owner or Junior Owner classes.**

Entries of persons suspended/expelled from USEF, a recognized competition may refuse entry of an exhibitor or participation of an agent/trainer/rider/driver/handler that has shown an objectionable attitude towards a recognized competition or its management or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a recognized competition.

Qualifications:

It is the responsibility of the person(s) signing the Entry Form to verify that the horse is eligible to be entered and compete in the Regional Championship class. Check the 2024 AHA Handbook for updated qualification guidelines.

EXHIBITORS MUST INCLUDE QUALIFICATION PAGE, IF COPY IS FROM AHA DOWNLOAD, YOU MUST IDENTIFY YOUR QUALIFYING CLASS. You may submit a Printed Qualification record from the AHA web site but must identify qualifying classes.

Paying by Credit Card: The credit card fee this year will be 3% of your total, there is a place on your entry form to note this amount. Enter the total amount from your entry form. Be sure to list the horse's name and amount in the "Notes" section. If the payment amount is for multiple horses or for other items, list the horse's name and amount for each horse in the "Notes". **Failure to do so will cause an additional fee of \$50.00 per horse to figure out what you did.** Help us with the details to make the entry process smooth. Enter your PayPal information on the entry blank. You must print out your PayPal confirmation receipt and include it with your form. You must print it out and include it with your entry form when you mail it in. **If this confirmation is not included with the entry form, a Post Entry Fee will be incurred.**

INCOMPLETE ENTRY FEE (\$25 per horse) may be assessed on any entry that is received without one or more of the following: An incomplete entry form (front & back); missing copies of registration papers; missing copies of AHA or USEF cards for trainers, owners, riders, drivers, handlers, any missing AHA, Region 9, USEF waivers.

Entry Refunds:

After the entry closing date of Monday, May 6, 2024 and prior to Thursday, May 23, 2024, withdrawals accompanied by a Veterinarian's Certification of Inability to Show or in the case of a rider, a Doctor's Certification of Inability to Show, will receive refunds of **class entry fees only**. **STALLS ORDERED ON ENTRY ARE NOT REFUNDABLE. NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AT THE SHOW.**

Post Entries:

Regular Post Entries: Horses may be entered after the close of entry, May 6, 2024, with a Post Entry Fee of \$75 per horse (in addition to the regular class fees). For post entries, it is preferred by the Secretary – Please email the entry - **it must be received by the Show Secretary by Wednesday, May 22, and the payment is brought to the Show Office by 5:00 PM Monday, May 27, 2024.** Your emailed entry will be confirmed by phone or email within 48 hours. If you do not receive a confirmation, please contact the Show Secretary immediately.

Courtesy Post Entries. Horses may be entered on or after **May 23, 2024**, at a \$175 per Horse fee (in addition to the regular class fees.) The horse must be entered by the end of the session preceding the class desired.

Added Classes:

Horses entered in the show on or before **May 6, 2024**, may **add a class** no later than 5:00pm on Monday, May 27, 2024 and will be assessed a post entry fee of \$50 per horse (in addition to the regular class fee.) Any horse that is not properly entered into a class and rides thru the gate will be charged a \$75 per class post entry fee.

Post entries will not have choice of sections or stabling.

There will be **no post entries** in any Cow Class, Dressage and Sport Horse In-Hand Classes after May 17, 2024.

Health Requirements – Coggins/Health Certificate:

Any Texas horse entering the grounds must be accompanied by a negative Coggins issued within 12 months by a licensed veterinarian. **Per TX law, any out-of-state horse entering the grounds must be accompanied by a health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of the show as well as a negative Coggins issued within 12 months.** These must be presented at the show office before numbers will be issued for this or any other horses owned by the same owner. Horses with any communicable diseases must immediately be removed from the show grounds. **Note: All equine coming from a vesicular stomatitis virus (VSV) affected state must have a Health Certificate (CVI) issued within 14 days prior to entry and a VSV status for the premises or area should be recorded on the CVI**

Equine Vaccination Rule: GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule:

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

Gate Calls:

Per USEF AR107.1: When horses are competing collectively, if a first horse does not enter the in-gate ready to participate within one minute from when the class is called into the ring, a warning is issued.

- a. Exhibitors will then have one additional minute to start the steady stream of horses into the in-gate.
- b. If no horses have entered the gate at the conclusion of the additional one minute, the gate shall be closed, and the class is deemed concluded.
- c. Once the first horse has entered the in-gate, a steady stream of horses must be maintained.
- d. Should the steady stream be broken after the two minutes have elapsed, the gate shall be closed, and judging will commence.
- e. A steady stream is defined as a constant flow of horses moving forward through the in-gate with a reasonable and safe distance between them (i.e., two to four horse or horse and buggy lengths in between).
- f. Show Management in conjunction with the Steward may deviate from this procedure as circumstances warrant.

The Paddock Master is the official timer appointed to enforce this rule. If a horse is showing as entered in a class but not present when the gate opens, the gate can only be closed prior to the end of the 2- minute call if the horse has been officially scratched [in the show office or by notification to the Paddock Master by owner or authorized individual/ trainer of entered horse].

Judging:

Breeding/In-Hand Classes: Regional halter classes will be comparatively judged, and placings determined by MOS, (see REQ 215) for Comparative Class Procedure.

Performance Classes: The MOS Scoring System will be used in all three judge classes; judges will be rotated in class/session order. Sport Horse, Dressage, Trail, Ranch Horse Riding, Reining, Reined Cow Horse, Working Cow, and Herd Work classes will use the Single Judge System.

Leadline Class: Exhibitors shall be at least two years of age and have not reached their 7th birthday as of December 1, 2023.

Leadline exhibitors are exempt from the AHA Membership with Competition Card requirements and USEF membership requirements. **Exhibitors may only ride a horse properly entered in the show.** Leaders must be at least 14 years of age. The safety of all exhibitors must be of the primary consideration when conducting the class. Any action by any exhibitor, leader, or horse that endangers that exhibitor or leader may be eliminated. Safety is of the utmost importance in tack and attire:

- 1 - Saddle must fit rider
- 2 - Rider's feet must be engaged in the stirrups/iron
- 3 - Leading rein must be attached to a cavesson or a halter placed under or over the bridle
- 4 - It is strongly encouraged that the rider wears protective headgear with harness secured which meets/exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag
- 5 - Boots are required.

There shall be only one rider on each horse; stallions are prohibited. The recommended appointments and attire are those deemed appropriate for a pleasure type class.

Performance Halter Classes:

PERFORMANCE HALTER (Res. 10-15) Shows may use either "In the Ring" or "Exit the Ring" procedure as identified in the Halter section of the Arabian Division in USEF/EC. *This Show will use "In the Ring" procedure.*

Comp.508.6 Performance halter horses will be judged using the Arabian Performance Halter Score Card. At Regional Championships utilizing a three-judge panel, the scorecards will be turned into placings and in turn, run through the Majority Opinion System (MOS) to determine the Champion, Reserve Champion and Top Five (BOD 12/20)

AR248 Versatility Ranch Horse Division (VRH) (New Division Added this year)

General 1. The Versatility Ranch classes will be held in accordance with AQHA rules for class conduct, judging, specific scoring, and patterns as modified by the following Arabian Rules. Where the Arabian Rules are silent, AQHA rules prevail.

2. The Versatility Ranch Horse division demonstrates the performance, versatility, and conformation of the Arabian and Half Arabian Horse as a working ranch horse. The intent is to reward an exhibitor and/or horse based on their level of expertise. Classes within the Versatility Ranch Horse Division may be held individually at approved competitions or held collectively as a Versatility Ranch Horse Competition.

3. VRH Ranch Riding and VRH Ranch Trail may be combined and held at the same time or held independently. If combined, each class will be scored individually and placed individually.

4. VRH Ranch Reining and VRH Ranch Cow Work may be combined and held at the same time, or each class held separately. If combined, each class will be scored individually and placed individually.

5. Multiple arenas may be used and encouraged to expedite the show to finish in a timely manner. Clinics or educational opportunities may be offered and are encouraged to be held prior to the competition.

6. Points will be awarded in each individual class according to the placing received and based on the total number of horses competing in that class. Points earned in each individual class only count toward any award or qualification for the Versatility Ranch Horse division.

7. **All-Around Versatility Ranch Horse.** The title of All-Around Versatility Ranch Horse may be awarded for each show in the open, amateur and youth divisions, if earned. Each division is to be calculated independently based on the number of horses competing in that division. Divisions may not be held concurrently (i.e., open classes may not run currently with amateur classes). All-around versatility ranch horse points are based on a one horse/one exhibitor combination. (See exception in ranch conformation for exhibitor with multiple horses.) A horse/exhibitor team is all-around eligible if it competes in at least one cattle class, at least one non-cattle riding class, and ranch conformation in the same division. At VRH shows, all exhibitors in every class must be placed. In scored classes, all exhibitors in class will be ranked according to score, placed from the highest to the lowest score. In ranch conformation, the entire class in each division must be placed. In all classes, the highest placing all-around eligible exhibitor will receive 50 credits, regardless of the number of other horses entered or eligible. Second highest all-around eligible exhibitor will receive 49 credits and so on. For example, an exhibitor competing for the all-around may place 16th in the class but is also the highest placing all-around eligible entry they will receive 50 credits. An exhibitor placing 22 in the same class, that is the second highest all-around eligible entry, will receive 49 credits and so on. Another example: In a class of six entries, if the highest placing all-around exhibitor places second, it will receive 50 credits. The second highest all-around eligible horse/exhibitor team places fourth in the class, they would receive 49 credits and so forth. After totaling credits for all-around-eligible entries in each class, the exhibitor receiving the highest number of credits in that division will be named the All-Around versatility ranch horse in that division and will receive additional points based on the number of horses competing for the all-around title. a. If there are ties in the final placing for the all-around Versatility Ranch Horse, they will be broken by the highest placing horse in the VRH Ranch Cow Work, VRH Limited Ranch Cow Work, whichever is applicable to the division. If this does not break the tie, other classes will be used in the following order: VRH Ranch Cutting, VRH Ranch Reining, VRH Ranch Trail, VRH Ranch Riding, and VRH Ranch Conformation.

8. No horses less than 3 years of age may be exhibited.

AR249 Versatility Ranch Horse Division Appointments and Conduct

1. Equipment with excessive silver should not count over good working tack. Excessive silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged.

2. Romal reins are allowed in all VRH classes, including VRH and Ranch Cutting. When riding with a romal, a get down rope may be used. A get down rope is defined as a small rope tied around the neck of the horse with a bowline or other non-slip knot and run back to the exhibitor or tied to the saddle. The get down will be used to lead, ground tie, or tie the horse. When ground-tying with split reins, one or both reins may be dropped, romal reins may be loosely draped over the horse when used with or without a get-down rope. The get-down rope may also be run through a bosalito, as long as the bosalito is not tight enough to function as a cavesson. If a bosalito is used, it must allow approximately 2 fingers (1 inch) to pass freely between the nose and the bosalito. The bosalito must be constructed of a flexible braided rawhide, leather or rope, the core of which must be flexible. Absolutely no rigid material will be permitted under the jaws, regardless of how padded or covered. Hobbles are allowed for Versatility Ranch Trail.

3. The use of two-rein equipment is permitted per horse in all VRH classes for one year only.

4. When exhibiting in a snaffle bit or hackamore, an exhibitor may switch between two hands and one hand on the reins at any time.
5. Hoof polish is prohibited.
6. No braided or banded manes/tails or tail extensions, except in any VRH class where roping is involved, the horse's mane may be braided for a distance of 12" - 16" in front of the saddle pad. No ribbons or other kind of ornamentation will be allowed.
7. Trimming inside ears is discouraged but will not be penalized.
8. Trimming bridle path, also trimming of fetlocks, and excessive (long) facial hair is permitted.
9. Holding the saddle horn with either hand is permitted in any class.
10. Posting at the extended trot is permitted.
11. In the case of a fall by a horse or exhibitor, the run must end when the exhibitor or horse fall to the ground. A horse is considered to have fallen when all four feet are extended in the same direction. An exhibitor is considered to have fallen when the exhibitor is no longer astride.

AR250 Versatility Ranch Horse Division Scoring

1. The scoring system is designed to be positive, straightforward, and always encourage growth and improvement in both horse and exhibitor. The scoring system is designed to give credit for the work done.
2. Except for the conformation class, each horse/exhibitor team is scored between 0-100 points and automatically begins the run with a score of 70 points. The horse/exhibitor team is scored on the quality of each maneuver (e.g., -1 1/2 extremely poor, -1 very poor, -1/2 poor, 0 correct, +1/2 good, +1 very good, +1 1/2 excellent). Plusses and minuses reflect the smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness, and authority of the horse/exhibitor team when performing the various maneuvers. Penalties may be accrued for incorrect maneuver execution.
3. In each class, the entire class will be scored and placed. All exhibitors in each class will be ranked according to scores, placed from the highest to the lowest scores.
4. No horse/exhibitor team can be disqualified except for lameness, abuse, prohibited equipment, disrespect, or misconduct, leaving working area before pattern is complete, improper western attire and or fall of horse/exhibitor. Disqualified horses will count as entries in the class but will not receive points.
5. In the case of equipment failure that delays competition or becomes unsafe, the run is stopped, and the horse/exhibitor team will be given credit for what they have accomplished prior to that point and will be considered off-pattern (OP), and receive the appropriate penalty.
6. In each class, a specific maneuver will be designated by the judge to be the tiebreaker. The tie-breaker maneuvers will be made prior to the start of the class and so noted on score sheets. Ties will be broken according to AR214. 7. Exhibitors competing for the All-Around Versatility Ranch Horse, must have their class placing credits entered into the all-around tabulation. Credits from each class must be added together for the overall placing for the event. Ties for the all-around versatile ranch horse are broken as per AR248.7.

AR251 Versatility Ranch Horse Division Judging Procedures

1. Judges must use approved score sheets to score all classes. Specific maneuvers will be selected by the judge prior to the class as tie-breaking maneuvers.
2. During the class, a scribe can assist each judge by recording the score after each of the maneuvers on the appropriate class score sheet. Judges must sign their score sheets.
3. Class score sheets must be posted as soon as possible after each class to allow exhibitors to evaluate their performance.
4. At the option of show management, when using two judges to determine one set of winners, the classes will first be placed under each judge and class placing points awarded and posted. One judge must be designated as the tie-breaking judge before judging begins. The composite results (combined results used to determine an overall winner) must be determined as follows: All class placing points will be added for each judge to determine an all-around winner. If there is a tie, the tie-breaking judge's class placing will determine the winner. Ties for the all-around winner are broken first using the highest placing in the ranch cow work class, or the limited ranch cow work class, whichever is applicable to the division.

AR255 VRH Ranch Trail General

1. The VRH Ranch Trail class should test the horse's ability to cope with situations encountered while being ridden through a pattern of obstacles generally found during everyday ranch work.
2. The horse/exhibitor team is judged on the correctness, efficiency, and pattern accuracy with which the obstacles are negotiated, and the attitude and mannerisms exhibited by the horse.
3. The ideal VRH ranch trail horse should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail in each maneuver.
4. Horses may cross enter Trail and VRH Ranch Trail regardless of division (youth, amateur, or open).

AR256 VRH Ranch Trail Course Information

1. The VRH Ranch Trail course will include no less than six and no more than nine obstacles.
2. It is mandatory that the horse be asked to walk, trot, and lope during the course. The walk can be part of an obstacle score or be scored with the approaching an obstacle. The trot must be at least 35 feet and scored with approaching obstacle. The lope must be lead-specific, at least 50 feet, and scored with approaching an obstacle.
3. Care must be exercised to avoid setting up any obstacles that may be hazardous to the horse or exhibitor.
4. When setting courses, management will be mindful that the idea is not to trap a horse/exhibitor team or eliminate it by making an obstacle too difficult. All courses and obstacles are to be constructed with safety in mind to reduce the risk for accidents.
5. Show committee can have the option of setting up the trail course to best fit the arena conditions. An outdoor course is recommended if appropriate terrain is available.
6. The show committee, either through a pilot run or estimation, must select a course that has a continuous and positive flow that can be negotiated in four minutes or less.
7. Judges must walk the course and are permitted to alter the course if it is not in keeping with the intent of the class. Judges must remove or change any obstacles they deem unsafe, non-negotiable, or unnecessarily difficult.
8. Any time a trail obstacle becomes unsafe during a class, it must be repaired or removed from the course. If the course cannot be repaired and some horses have completed the course, the score for that obstacle must be deducted from all previous draws in that class.
9. The pattern must be posted at least one hour prior to class.

AR257 VRH Ranch Trail Course Obstacles

1. The course must be designed using the mandatory obstacles and maneuvers plus optional obstacles. Combining two or more of the obstacles is permitted.
2. Prohibited Obstacles: Tarps, water obstacles with slick bottoms, PVC pipe used as a jump or walk over, tires, rocking or moving bridges, painted logs or poles, logs elevated in a manner that permits such to roll in a dangerous manner.
3. Mandatory Obstacles and/or Maneuvers a. Ride over obstacles on the ground (natural logs are required). Walk, trot or lope may be used but only one gait is required.
 1. **Walkovers:** Walk over no more than five logs at no more than 10", high and spacing between 26"–30". The formation may be straight, curved, zig-zagged, or raised.
 2. **Trot-overs:** Trot over no more than five logs at no more than 10" high. The space between logs or poles should be 36"-42". The formation can also be straight, curved, zig-zagged or raised.
 3. **Lope-overs:** Lope over no more than five logs at no more than 10" high. The space between logs should be 6 to 7 feet. The formation can also be straight, curved, zig-zagged or raised.
 - b. Opening, passing through, and closing a hinged swinging gate (not a rope gate): A gate that will not endanger horse or exhibitor and requires minimum side-passing must be used.
 - c. Ride over wooden bridge: Bridge should be sturdy, safe, and negotiated at a walk only. Heavy plywood lying flat on the ground is permitted simulation of a bridge. Minimum width must be 36" wide and at least 6 feet long.
 - d. Backing obstacles: Backing obstacles must be spaced at a minimum of 28". If elevated, 30" spacing is required. Back through and around at least three markers. Back through L, V, U or straight or similarly shaped course which may be elevated no more than 24".
 - e. Side-pass obstacle: Raised side pass obstacles should not exceed 12". Any object which is safe and of any length may be used to demonstrate responsiveness of the horse to leg signals.
 - f. Drag an object: For open, and amateur classes only. The drag is not to be used in youth and rookie/novice classes. Drag may be a complete figure eight (or other shape) and may begin in either direction. The exhibitor must have the rope dallyed on the saddle horn (half or full dally) for the duration of the drag.
4. Optional obstacles may be used provided the obstacles can be found in everyday ranch work. Optional obstacles from which selections can be made include, but are not limited to: a. A jump obstacle whose center height is a minimum of 14" high but no more than 25" high. Holding the saddle horn is permitted for this obstacle.
 - b. Only live or stuffed animals which would normally be encountered in an outdoor setting may be used but not to be used to spook a horse.
 - c. Carry object from one part of the arena to another.
 - d. Remove and replace materials from a mailbox.
 - e. Trot through cones spaced a minimum of 6 feet apart.
 - f. Cross natural ditches or ride up embankments.
 - g. Swing rope or throw rope at a dummy steer head.
 - h. Step in and out of obstacle.
 - i. Put on slicker or coat.
 - j. Stand to mount with mounting block.
 - k. Walk through water obstacle.
 - l. Open gate on foot.
 - m. Pick up feet.

- n. Walk through brush.
- o. Ground tie. (Hobbles are allowed)
- p. Lead at the trot.

AR258 VRH Ranch Trail Scoring

1. Judging emphasis is on identifying the well broke, responsive, and well-mannered horse which can correctly navigate and negotiate the course.
2. All runs begin upon entering the pen and any infractions are subject to penalty at that time (such as two hands on the reins, using either hand to instill fear or praise, etc.).
3. The exhibitor has the option of eliminating any obstacle, however this will result in being "off pattern" (OP) and the horse/exhibitor team will receive a 10-point penalty for each obstacle eliminated.
4. A judge may ask a horse to pass on an obstacle after three refusals or at any time for safety concerns and will then likewise receive a 10-point penalty.
5. Credit is given to horse/exhibitor teams who negotiate the obstacles correctly and efficiently.
6. Horses should receive credit for showing attentiveness to obstacles and ability to negotiate through the course when the obstacles warrant it while willingly responding to exhibitor's cues on more difficult obstacles.
7. Quality of movement and cadence should be considered part of the maneuver score for the obstacle.
8. Maneuver evaluations and penalty applications are to be determined independently. The following penalties will be applied to each occurrence and be deducted from the final score:

VRH Ranch Trail Penalties – Penalties must follow the current AQHA penalties with the following exceptions –

1. Ten (10) point penalties
 - A. Off pattern (see AR258.8.b.4)
 - B. Unnatural (Arabian) Ranch Horse appearance, see AR105.2b.
2. Zero (0) score
 - A. Major disobedience or schooling
 - B. Prohibited use of fingers or hands on reins
 - C. Any deviation of the scoring contained within the current Arabian rules, the references within AQHA, NRHA, or NRCHA rulebooks regarding scoring will prevail.
1. 1 point: Over-bridled (per maneuver); out of frame (per maneuver); each hit, bite or stepping on a log, cone plant or any component of the obstacle; incorrect or break of gait at walk or trot for two (2) strides or less; both front or hind feet in a single-stride slot or space at a walk or trot; skipping over or failing to step into required space; split pole in lope-over; incorrect number of strides, if specified; one to two steps on mount/dismount or ground tie except shifting to balance.
2. 3 point: Wrong lead or out of lead, draped reins; break of gait at lope, except when correcting an incorrect lead; break of gait at walk or trot for more than two (2) strides; three to four steps on mount/dismount on ground tie.
3. 5 point: Spurring in front of cinch; blatant disobedience; use of either hand to instill fear/praise; knocking over, stepping out of or falling off an obstacle; dropping an object required to be carried; 1st or 2nd cumulative refusal; letting go of gate; five or more steps on mount/ dismount or ground tie.
4. Off-Pattern (OP): Incomplete maneuver; eliminating or adding a maneuver; Failure to complete pattern as written; Third refusal; repeated blatant disobedience, and failure to dally and remain dallied during the drag; use of two hands (except junior horses shown in a snaffle bit/hackamore), more than one finger between split reins or any fingers between romal reins (except in the two-rein); failure to open and shut gate, or failure to complete gate.
5. No Score/Disqualification (DQ): Lameness, abuse, leaving working area before pattern is complete, prohibited equipment, disrespect or misconduct, improper western attire; fall of horse/exhibitor.

AR259 Ranch Horse Trail Walk-Trot 10 & Under

- General 1. Exhibitors must not be more than ten (10) years of age as of December 1 of the current competition year.
2. The exhibitor must never have been judged in a class at a Licensed Competition that required a canter or lope. (Exception: Short Stirrup Reining exhibitors and Cross Rails 10 & Under).

AR260 Ranch Horse Trail Walk-Trot 10 & Under Appointments

Horse and exhibitor must follow the appointments as set forth in the Arabian Western Pleasure Sub-Chapter.

AR261 Ranch Horse Trail Walk-Trot 10 & Under Course Information

1. Acceptable Obstacles:
 - a. The ranch trail walk-trot course will include between six (6) and nine (9) obstacles. It is mandatory that the horse be asked to walk and trot during the course. The walk can be part of an obstacle score or be scored with the approaching obstacles. The trot must cover at least 35 feet and be scored with the approaching an obstacle. Care must be exercised to avoid setting up any obstacle that may be hazardous to the horse or exhibitor.
 - b. Ride over obstacles on the ground (usually logs). Walk or trot may be used, but only one gait is required.

- c. Walk-overs: no more than five (5) logs no more than 10" high and spacing between 26" to 30". The formation may be straight, curved, or zig-zagged, but not raised.
- d. Trot-overs: no more than five (5) logs no more than 10" high and spacing 36" to 42". The formation can also be straight, curved, or zig-zagged, but not raised.
- e. Open Gates- Exhibitors shall not be asked to open and close a gate; however, simulation of doing so by touching gate standards is encouraged. A single non-elevated walk over pole may be placed in the "open" gate.
- f. Ride over a wooden bridge. The bridge must be safe, unobstructed (no poles or obstacles on the bridge), sturdy, and negotiated at a walk only.
- g. Straight Back Through - must be 40" or greater in width. f. A live or stuffed animal which would normally be encountered in an outdoor setting may be used but not to be used in an attempt to spook a horse.
- h. Trot through cones: cones must be spaced a minimum of ten (10) feet apart.
- i. Swing rope or throw a rope at a dummy steer head.
- j Step in and out of obstacle.
- k. Turns of 90 or 180 degrees within a box or confined area no smaller than 8' x 8' or turns of 270 or 360 degrees within a box or confined area of no less than 10' x 10'.

2. Prohibited Obstacles

- a. Water or Water boxes
- b. Drags
- c. Closed gates
- d. Pick up objects
- e. Side pass



Once again, we are going with a strictly sponsorship program this year. The program will be the same as last year. Each barn stabled in the Richardson-Bass Building (Will Rogers) will need to purchase a Platinum package for each aisleway they have (if you have more than 2 stall fronts, you will need to purchase 2 packages).

Once Again Craft Culinary will be providing the food. This is the same company who has done our exhibitor parties the last 3 years. We have looked at going back and adding food this year to the patron's package and the cost of the food is so high that just the food alone would be \$20-25/meal. Due to this cost the Patrons would end up costing about \$2000 per package of 4 meal tickets. This is entirely too much to spend.

As a result of this cost, we are going to go forward and have 3 exhibitor meals this year. Dinner on Wednesday Evening, Lunch on Thursday Afternoon and Dinner on Friday Evening. 



USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
