This Standard establishes the foundation of a progressive program directed toward continued improvement of those qualities essential for all breeds and varieties of pure bred Poultry, either for breeding or exhibition purposes at our Poultry shows, as POULTRY SHOWS ARE THE SHOW WINDOWS OF THE STANDARD BRED POULTRY INDUSTRY.

Membership

A continued steady growth of this Association has been accomplished. Today we are a parent organization representing over 1200 breeders and potential exhibitors, dedicated to the objectives of our Association, composed of breeders, exhibitors and Licensed American Poultry Association Judges. Numerous other organizations with parallel objectives have joined our Association in recent years. Memberships are invited by any and all who may have an interest in our objectives. We are members of the American Poultry Association, Western Fairs Association and the American Bantam Association.

MOTTO: To retain and improve our California Poultry Shows.

As a challenge, this MOTTO was selected in 1958. Realization that a NEW LOOK was essential to retain and also re-capture sufficient interest on the part of the FAIR GOER that would justify continuance of Poultry Exhibits, by Fair Managements, at our County and District Fairs. Curtailment of these exhibit facilities had already occurred in a number of instances, as a consequence the Pacific Breeders Association developed a program consisting of numerous ideas, innovations, as recommended suggestions to accomplish this NEW LOOK. The program was titled FEATHERS AND FUR and for presentation to Fair Managers interested in a new approach to public approval of the Fairs Standard Bred Poultry

display sections. The IMAGE of this proposed **program** was described and discussed with the Fairs and Expositions Division at Sacramento on February 17th, 1961. The Division expressed themselves as encouraged and pleased to learn that our organization had prepared this suggested program which the Division felt was workable, suggesting contact with the various Fair Managements, outlining the program. Several contacts were made with reasonable success and are being continued.

Premium Awards. Public Relations

It became increasingly evident that better communication was essential, between the Fairs and Expositions Division and the Pacific Poultry Breeders Association, exposure of our common problems needed to be resolved, if our ultimate objections were to be accomplished. Several visits to the Division were made with gratifying results and today a more harmonious situation prevails, than has existed in the past, which will be of benefit to all concerned in the future. Several recommended changes now are included in the 1962 MASTER PREMIUM LIST, including an upward adjustment in the Poultry premium award offerings.

Promotion . . . Newsletter

This news bulletin is issued each month and circulated to the membership and others, Contents cover information of interest and current Association activities.

Membership-Breeders Directory.

This directory is available, it lists the names and addresses of reliable breeder-members, likewise the various breeds and varieties available, to those interested in obtaining pure bred foundation Standard Bred Poultry, to start or improve their present strains.

Association Meetings.

Meetings are held each month; interesting, instructive discussions of educational value on subjects concerning STANDARD BRED POULTRY. These discussions are of value to the be-

ginner, as they cover basic subjects, such as mating, breeding, hatching, medication, culling and raising of Poultry. They are preparing him to start a sound breeding program of his own, likewise the opportunity of learning about the various breeds of Standard Bred Poultry which are available.

Educational Booth, Standard Bred Poultry.

To obtain additional public exposure, among FAIR GOERS, the Pacific Poultry Breeders Association has prepared material needed for erection of an attractive colorful information booth available for use in the poultry Sections of our County and District Fairs. This booth is available without cost to those Fair Managers who believe it would be useful. Members qualified, with acceptable knowledge of Standard Bred Poultry, will operate the booth, during the open hours of the Fair, and furnish information to those FAIR GOERS making inquiries. GROUP TOURS by an Association member can be arranged, throughout the POULTRY SECTION of the Fair.
