Alice also stated that Esdale mentioned that he purchased the mailbox because people were trying to look for him. In addition Esdale gave a black T-Shirt with the phrase, "With Liberty and Justice for Sale"; this t-shirt is on Esdale's website. Alice stated that she still had the t-shirt in the office and showed it to SA Perez. With this information it proved that Esdale was in the area.

Alice informed Perez that Esdale stated to her that if she or anyone she knows wanted to buy a t-shirt for ten dollars to call him at 954-695-0121. This number was a current phone number. SA Perez asked Alice if there was a current home address for Esdale. Alice looked at Esdale's record and indicated that Esdale documented the address of 1363 Springside Drive, Weston, Florida.

With the information gathered at the Pak-Mail, SA Perez would try to identify the phone number given to him by the Pak-Mail employee, and attempt to get a subpoena on the number to identify if this was the phone number that was used to call DGC Brennan's Office.

SA Perez identified that the number given to him by the Pak-Mail employee was from a Cingular Wireless cellular phone. In addition it was determined that Esdale was married to Lisa Esdale and had a son in the Broward County School District. SA Perez also received copies of the voicemail messages left by Steven Esdale on DGC Brennan's Office. The voicemails verified the information given to Perez that the individual named Steven Esdale left five agitated and upset voicemails (placed into related items).

At approximately 3:00 PM, SA Perez informed the regional legal advisor for Miami, Jackie Boswell, the information and the facts of the case. Perez requested assistance to retrieve cellular phone records for Esdale's cell phone (954-██████████), for the period of February 20-25, 2006 for incoming and outgoing phone calls, the time frame in which the voicemails were made at DGC Brennan's Office. Perez also let Boswell listen to the voicemails and informed her of Esdale's website. With this information, it was determined to verify Esdale's location, interview him and possibly determine if an involuntary mental health evaluation is needed (Baker Act).

This case is ongoing and will be updated accordingly.
