

ABOUT YOUTHPASS











"Road to success" is a Youth Exchange held in Mol, Belgium, focused on the importance of developing youngsters' and youth workers' teamwork and leadership skills. The participants were able to learn more about the different kinds of decision-making that have improved their sense of entrepreneurship contributed to successful their more employability. The working international environment has changed over the last 20 years and still is changing. Due to the poor development education within this changing professional requirements it was highly beneficial to participate in a project which informs the youth about the impact and importance of soft skills and personal development that have become more important in the last few years. "Road to Success" has gathered 42 participants from 7 countries from all over Europe. All of our participants were between the ages of 18 to 30. The activities and methods which were used during the project include presentations, workshops, debates, games, outdoor activities, and simulations. These activities are designed to utilize communication and soft skills. We aimed to foster the personal and professional development of young people by helping them to develop teamwork skills, initiative, leadership, communication, social and motivational skills within the international working environment. We wanted to contribute to the creation of more educated, professional, outgoing, open-minded, critical, social youth that is aware of democracy and social rights and the importance of interpersonal skills.





























OBJECTIVES

The need to improve the quality and relevance of the skills and competences that young Europeans have, has been recognised at both national and European level. Moreover, given the current situation in Europe, with high rates of youth unemployment and, in some cases, serious skills mismatches, it is urgent to address this issue. More than 3.3 million young people (aged 15-26 years) are unemployed in 2019 in the EU. In 2018, more than 5.5 million young people (aged 15-26 years) were neither in employment nor in the education or training (NEETs) in EU. COUNCIL RECOMMENDATION of 22 May 2018 on key competences for lifelong learning: People need the right set of skills and competences to sustain current standards of living, support high employment and foster social cohesion in the light of tomorrow's society and world of work.

Thanks to this project the participants have improved their skills regarding teamwork, effective communication, crisis management, strategic thinking and how to be successful. In long term, the participants will acquire knowledge on how they can influence community`s and their own well-being. They will be able to handle difficult situations and take responsibility for the consequences of their own actions. They learnt how to actively enhance their behavior in favor of their personal and professional life. Thanks to the increase of theoretical and practical knowledge on the different types of leadership and their applicability to youth work the participants will have a higher chance of employability and growth in competences by using various leadership techniques in daily work. Exploring different cultures was also a positive long-term effect for the participants and they have created new friendships all over Europe. This can foster tolerance and mutual understanding which is a key importance for a successful team.



Enable and ensure the inclusion of all young people in society.










INFORMATION AND CONSTRUCTIVE DIALOGUE

· Youthpass is connected with all kind of projects and activities within the Erasmus+: Youth in Action and European Solidarity Corps programmes, participants must meet the conditions needed for these kind of projects

STATISTICS

- · Approximately 80% of participants agreed that Youthpass helps to communicate the importance of non-formal learning and increases the usefulness of the project for participants.
- · Between 70% and 80% of participants planned to use Youthpass when applying for a job. More than 40% of respondents saw the potential of using Youthpass when applying for higher education or setting up a business.
