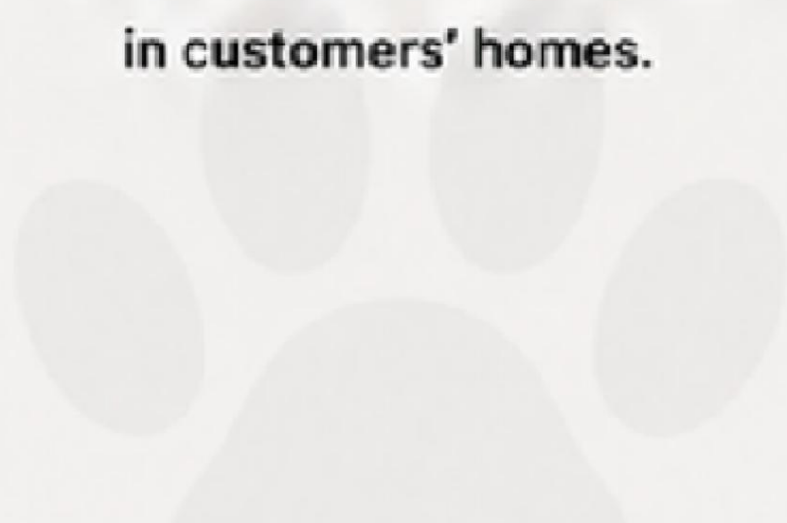

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REFRIGERATION



Tips and maintenance advice to help

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REFRIGERATOR MAINTENANCE TIPS

Cooler Performance. Longer Life. Less Waste.

Simple steps to keep your refrigerator running efficiently and your food fresher, longer.



1 CLEAN THE CONDENSER COILS EVERY 6 MONTHS

Dusty coils make your fridge work harder and use more energy. Clean with a coil brush or vacuum.



2 CHECK AND MAINTAIN THE RIGHT TEMPERATURE

Refrigerator: 37–40°F | Freezer: 0°F
Use an appliance thermometer to keep it accurate.



3 INSPECT THE DOOR SEALS

Close a dollar bill in the door. If it slides out easily, the seal may need cleaning or replacement.



4 KEEP THE DRAIN HOLE CLEAR

A clogged drain can cause water leaks and ice buildup. Use warm water and a small brush.



5 DON'T OVERPACK YOUR FRIDGE

Good airflow keeps temperatures even and helps your fridge run more efficiently.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

A professional inspection can catch small issues before they become costly repairs.



PRO TIP: Wipe door seals with warm, soapy water and keep condenser coils clean. Small steps now prevent big problems later.



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ICE MAKER MAINTENANCE TIPS

Clear Ice. Clean System. Always Ready.

Simple steps to keep your ice maker producing fresh ice and lasting longer.



1 CHANGE THE WATER FILTER REGULARLY

Replace your water filter every 6 months or as recommended. Clean, filtered water makes better-tasting ice and prevents buildup.



2 CLEAN THE ICE MAKER EVERY 3–6 MONTHS

Use an ice machine cleaner to remove mineral scale, slime, and bacteria. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.



3 KEEP THE AIR VENTS CLEAN

Dirt and dust on vents can restrict airflow and reduce ice production. Clean the front grille and side/back vents regularly.



4 CHECK WATER SUPPLY AND CONNECTIONS

Make sure the water line is not kinked or frozen and connections are tight. Look for leaks and low water pressure.



5 KEEP THE ICE BIN CLEAN

Empty and clean the bin regularly with mild soap and warm water. Make sure the bin is completely dry before use.



6 MONITOR PERFORMANCE

If ice production slows, cubes are small, or you notice odors, clean the unit and check the filter and water supply.



PRO TIP: Run a cleaning cycle every 3–6 months and always use high-quality filtered water. This keeps ice clear, tastes great, and extends the life of your ice maker.



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SAMSUNG ICE ROOM TROUBLESHOOTING

Clear Ice. Consistent Production. Reliable Performance.

The Ice Room (left side) is where ice is made and stored. Use this guide to quickly identify and fix common issues.

ICE ROOM LOCATION

Left side of the freezer behind the ice bin. 

COMMON SYMPTOMS



No Ice

Ice maker not producing.



Low Ice Production

Small cubes or slow rate.



Ice Clumping

Cubes stuck together.



Ice Room Too Warm

Ice melting in the bin.



Ice Maker Error Codes

Ex: 40C, 41C, 39E, 1C

SYMPTOM • CAUSE • FIX

SYMPTOM	POSSIBLE CAUSE	FIX
 No Ice	- Ice Maker is OFF - Water supply issue - Frozen water line - Faulty ice maker - Main control board	- Turn Ice Maker ON (blue switch on ice maker) - Check water line for kinks or leaks - Thaw frozen water line - Test ice maker (replace if no harvest) - Check for voltage at ice maker
 Low Ice Production	- Dirty water filter - Low water pressure - Dirty condenser coils - Frozen evaporator coil - Restricted air flow	- Replace water filter (every 6 months) - Water pressure 30–120 PSI - Clean condenser coils - Defrost evaporator (manual or auto) - Keep vents and ice room door clear
 Ice Clumping	- Fluctuating temp - High humidity - Long ice storage - Dirty or faulty auger	- Keep freezer at 0°F (-18°C) or below - Ensure door seals are tight - Use ice regularly - Clean or replace auger motor if needed
 Ice Room Too Warm	- Door not sealing - Door left open - Frost build up - Defrost system issue	- Check and clean door gasket - Avoid leaving door open - Manual defrost if needed - Test defrost heater, sensor & thermistor
 Error Codes (40C, 41C, 39E, 1C)	- Fan failure (40C) - Ice maker temp sensor (41C) - Ice maker or harvest issue (39E) - Communication error (1C)	- Check ice room fan (should run) - Check/replace ice maker temp sensor - Inspect ice maker & connections - Reset unit, check wiring & boards



PRO TIP:

Power cool the unit after any repair or defrost.
Remove and reinsert the ice bucket to reset the ice maker.



QUICK CHECKS

- ☐ Ice Maker switch is ON (blue)
- ☐ Water line is connected & valve is ON
- ☐ Water filter is not expired
- ☐ Freezer temp is 0°F (-18°C) or below
- ☐ Door seals are clean and tight
- ☐ No heavy frost on back wall or floor
- ☐ Ice bucket is fully seated
- ☐ No error codes on display

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE



Clean Ice Room Every 3–6 Months

Remove ice bin and chute. Wash with warm water & mild soap. Rinse and dry.



Replace Water Filter Every 6 Months

Use genuine Samsung filter for best ice quality and flow.



Keep Coils Clean

Vacuum or brush condenser coils every 6–12 months.

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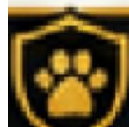

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DISHWASHER MAINTENANCE TIPS

Sparkling Results. Longer Life. Less Hassle.

Simple steps to keep your dishwasher cleaning effectively and prevent costly repairs.



1 CLEAN THE FILTER REGULARLY

A clean filter prevents clogs and keeps your dishwasher cleaning efficiently. Rinse and remove debris weekly.



2 CHECK AND CLEAN THE SPRAY ARMS

Remove food particles and buildup from spray arms so water can reach every dish.



3 USE THE RIGHT DETERGENT

Use high-quality dishwasher detergent and the right amount. Pods, gel, or powder all work—just use as directed.



4 CHECK RINSE AID LEVEL

Rinse aid helps prevent spots and improves drying. Keep it filled for the best results.



5 USE HOT WATER

Water should be at least 120°F entering the dishwasher for optimal cleaning and sanitizing.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

A professional inspection can catch small issues early and keep your dishwasher running like new.



PRO TIP: Run an empty cleaning cycle once a month with a dishwasher cleaner or a cup of white vinegar to remove buildup and keep your dishwasher fresh.



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RANGE & OVEN MAINTENANCE TIPS

Better Cooking. Longer Life. Less Risk.

Simple steps to keep your range and oven working safely and performing their best.



1 KEEP BURNERS AND GRATES CLEAN

Food and grease buildup can affect performance and create safety hazards. Clean regularly.



2 CLEAN THE OVEN REGULARLY

Baked-on grease and spills can cause smoke and odors. Clean the interior, racks, and door glass.



3 CHECK OVEN TEMPERATURE ACCURACY

Use an oven thermometer to verify temperature. Most ovens can drift over time.



4 CLEAN OR REPLACE RANGE HOOD FILTERS

Grease buildup reduces airflow and increases fire risk. Clean filters monthly.



5 INSPECT ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS (GAS OR ELECTRIC)

Loose connections can cause performance issues or be a safety hazard. Have it checked if needed.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

A professional inspection can catch small issues before they become expensive repairs.



PRO TIP: Wipe up spills as soon as the surface cools. It prevents buildup, keeps your range looking great, and reduces smoke while cooking.



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MICROWAVE MAINTENANCE TIPS

Better Performance. Safer Use. Longer Life.

Simple steps to keep your microwave clean, safe, and working like new.



1 KEEP IT CLEAN INSIDE AND OUT

Wipe up spills after each use. Use a damp cloth with mild soap. Clean the door, handle, and control panel.



2 CHECK THE TURNTABLE AND ROLLER RING

Remove the turntable and roller ring. Wash with warm, soapy water and keep the area underneath clean.



3 KEEP VENTS CLEAR

Make sure the vents on top, sides, and back are unobstructed for proper airflow and to prevent overheating.



4 USE MICROWAVE-SAFE CONTAINERS

Use only microwave-safe dishes and cover food to prevent splatters and ensure even heating.



5 DOOR SEAL AND LATCH CHECK

Inspect the door seal and latches regularly. If the door doesn't close tightly, energy can leak and cooking suffers.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL INSPECTION

A professional inspection can catch issues early and keep your microwave performing safely and efficiently.



PRO TIP: To remove odors, microwave a bowl of water with lemon slices for 3–5 minutes. Let it sit for a few minutes, then wipe clean for a fresh, clean smell.



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GARBAGE DISPOSAL MAINTENANCE TIPS

Smooth Operation. Fewer Clogs. Longer Life.

Simple steps to keep your garbage disposal running safely and efficiently.



1 ALWAYS RUN COLD WATER

Cold water keeps grease solid so it can be broken up and flushed through the drain.



2 AVOID THE WRONG FOODS

Don't put grease, coffee grounds, fibrous foods, pasta, rice, or bones down the disposal.



3 USE IT REGULARLY

Frequent use helps keep the blades free and prevents rust from setting in.



4 CLEAN AND REFRESH MONTHLY

Run ice cubes to help clean the blades, then grind citrus peels for a fresh scent.



5 NEVER USE CHEMICAL DRAIN CLEANERS

They can damage the disposal and plumbing. Stick to safe, natural cleaning methods.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

A professional inspection can catch worn parts early and keep your disposal running like new.



PRO TIP: If your disposal hums but won't grind, turn it off immediately. Check for a jam using the allen wrench under the unit, then clear and reset.



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LAUNDRY



Simple maintenance
steps to help your
washer and dryer
run clean, efficient,
and dependable.



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WASHER MAINTENANCE TIPS



Keep It Clean. Keep It Running.



1 CHECK HOSES MONTHLY

Inspect for cracks, bulges, or leaks.
Replace if worn.



2 LEAVE THE DOOR OPEN AFTER USE

Helps prevent mold and mildew buildup
in front-load washers.



3 RUN A CLEANING CYCLE ONCE A MONTH

Use washer cleaner or a hot cycle
with white vinegar.



4 DON'T OVERLOAD THE DRUM

Too much laundry strains the motor
and suspension.



5 USE THE RIGHT DETERGENT

HE detergent only! Excess suds can
damage the machine and reduce performance.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

Catch small issues before they
become big problems.



PRO TIP: Wipe the door seal and detergent drawer
regularly to keep odors away and your washer
running at its best.



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DRYER MAINTENANCE TIPS

Keep It Clean. Keep It Safe. Keep It Running.

Simple steps to improve performance, prevent breakdowns, and reduce fire risk.



1 CLEAN THE LINT TRAP AFTER EVERY LOAD

A clean lint trap improves drying time and reduces fire risk.



2 CLEAN THE DRYER VENT REGULARLY

Lint buildup in the vent can cause longer dry times, overheating, and potential fires.



3 AVOID OVERLOADING THE DRUM

Overloading restricts airflow and causes uneven drying and extra wear.



4 CHECK FOR GOOD AIRFLOW

Make sure the vent hose is not kinked or crushed and the outside vent flap opens freely.



5 KEEP THE DRUM AND SEAL CLEAN

Wipe the drum and door seal to prevent odors and keep clothes smelling fresh.



6 SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

A professional cleaning and inspection can catch issues early and extend the life of your dryer.



PRO TIP: If clothes are taking longer than normal to dry, your vent may be clogged. Clean it now and save time, energy, and money.
