Breeding *Neolamprologus maranguensis* by Cameron Turner

In the early summer of 2009 I picked up a wild caught pair of *Neolamprologus maranguensis* from KWA forum member Brandon Jolly. These fish are simply stunning with their long flowing baby-blue fin extensions and baby blue eyes. They are fairly docile compared to the horror stories I've heard for other *Neolamprologus* when spawning. That said, they did get their own 30G tank with no other fish in it just in case. These beauties grow to about 3-4" in size and they are found in a few locations in lake Tanganyika. They are found in the shallower waters where overhanging rocks form caves. They are carnivores and favour invertebrates for their diet. Spawning them was a matter of letting them get settled for 4-6 weeks and feeding them high quality foods. I'm lazy when it comes to food, so if it can't be kept near the tank at room temp then it's not on the menu. These guys got a blend of NLS pellets and premium flake. From then on, so long as there weren't fry already in the tank all it took was a 30-40 water change with water about 2-3C colder than the tank. Within a week there were free swimming fry being guarded by the parents.

The fry lived quite happily with the parents for as long as I was willing to let them be together. Once, as an experiment, I left fry in the spawning tank for 4 months to see if they'd go multigenerational for me. Unfortunately they did not. So long as there were fry the parents just watched them grow up.

The tank setup was a 30G bare-bottomed tank, painted on three sides with rock-textured spray paint. I added some rocks to form caves, and a #5 reticulated sponge filter. The female stayed under the filter except when courting, guarding fry or eating and the male stayed in the rock work almost exclusively. I was never able to watch them spawn, and I never saw eggs. As is common for this group of fish (substrate spawners), the eggs were probably laid someplace out of sight and guarded for a few days. The fry are fairly quick growers until they get about .7" then they slow down considerably. At seven months they are just over an inch and a half.

In my research I came across numerous mentions for the theory that this species arose from a natural crossing of *N. splendens* and *N. gracilis*. I'll have to check them both out too.

For anyone who is interested the parents have been sold but I still have quite a few F1 fry around in my grow out tanks. -

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Ancistrus “Snowflake” Spawning Report By Jerry Riegel

I obtained eight “SnowFlakes” from Stephan Tanner (Columbus, OH) during the GCAS winter Swap Meet in 2007. They were fry/juvenile size. They grew quickly and spawned for me about six months later. I was happy as a pig in dirt. Then they stopped.

Maybe they were on a winter schedule. I don't know. I didn't know what to do. So, I sexed them and found I only had two females. I wasn't even sure I had females because these ladies have a little mustache or set of bristles. So the first thing I tried was to separate the females and to condition them. Then, I introduced a male. No luck for about two or three months. Then, I tried another male. No luck again. I was quite frustrated.

Now through this whole ordeal, I was Googling them (not much information because they are new to the Hobby) and sending emails asking for advice. All information was processed and all suggestions were heeded. Still no luck.

So I did what we all do. I put them all in a tank together. I figured I would give them one last chance. I did not expect much. In essence, I wrote them off.

Of course, they spawned. I put the father and fry in a special tank away from the colony. I treated them like kings. They did quite well. I had a second spawn shortly after the first. Again, I separated them and treated them well. They all prospered.

Now I just leave the fry in the tank with the adult colony. They seem to do very good. The fry come out at feeding time and eat like little pigs. I am in the process of moving some of the larger fry into a 65 gallon grow out tank with some Montezuma Swords and some Tatia catfish. I am watching the first batch to see how they do. The spawning tank is getting a little crowded.

Now that I have these guys spawning, it is as easy as 1, 2, 3. I feed them well and they get a power filter for current. I think they also like the colony or the group experience. Of course, there are plenty of caves for the group of different sizes and textures. They have a large choice of caves to use for spawning. They get Cincy tap water and the temperature is high 70's.

The black body and white dots make these fish extremely attractive. And they have all the qualities that all Ancistrus exhibit (eat algae, not shy, small size, etc.). I expect these guys to be a staple fish in our club for a long time. They are really nice.

Breeding Chalinochromis Ndobnoi By Steve Smith

These Juli like cichlids are from Lake Tanganyika in Africa. Like Juli's they are a substrate spawner, however they are a fairly peaceful colony spawner. I borrowed a colony of 8 2.5-33.5 inch fish from Mike Satkowski (who had traded for them as fry from Chris Holt)and placed them in a 40 gallon tank with some Pseudotropheus Polit whom they co-existed with for many months. When I sold the Pseudotropheus Polit adults and replaced them with some young albino Pseudotropheus Socolofi they became the dominant fish in the tank and proceeded to breed. A pair took over half the length of the tank and one fish disappeared from sight for a few weeks to reappear with dozens of small fry. The tiny fry were immediately brought out to display on the top of a rock pile where they remained for a week or so. As time went on the fry were allowed to hide under smaller rocks to the side of the rock pile but no other fish were allowed in that end of the tank. The female remained in her half the tank and kept all fish out while after a month the male started patrolling the entire tank. In Mike's set up the male also bred with a second female in the other end of the tank. At this point all the excess fish were kept to the upper couple of inches of space at the top of the tank.

I have kept the 10 fry from the one breeding and Chris traded back for the adults, so this species should be secure in the GCAS for quite a while.





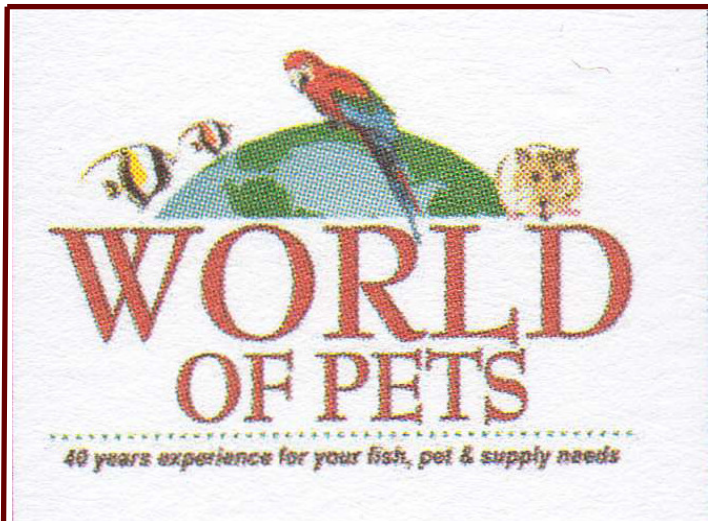


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Future GCAS Speakers-2010

Banquet speaker Dec. 4th, 2010

Chuck Davis

Started in the hobby at 9 years old – 1955, Got interested in catfish and cichlids almost immediately; joining the organized hobby in 1972 - the North Jersey Aquarium Society, and the American Cichlid Association in 1974. Chuck has held every position in NJAS and is still the Editor of their monthly publication (26 years), The Reporter. Served four Board terms with the ACA and chaired two ACA conventions. Organized and led the first Peruvian Amazon collecting trip for hobbyists in 1987. He has owned two pet shops and a wholesale tropical fish business. Chuck specialized in showing tropical fish and has won over 800 show awards, with an emphasis on cichlids, catfish and goldfish. He wrote the Society News column in AFM for almost twelve years. He is a Life Member of NJAS and the ACA, and a Lifetime Achievement designee of the Northeast Council of Aquarium Societies and the AFISH aquarium group of New York and also currently a member of the Gold Coast Aquarium Society of South Florida. Chuck lectures around the country on catfish, showing fish, collecting in Florida and on gizmos, gadgets and good ideas for the aquarium. He has been a banquet speaker for many conventions, offering more humor than information.

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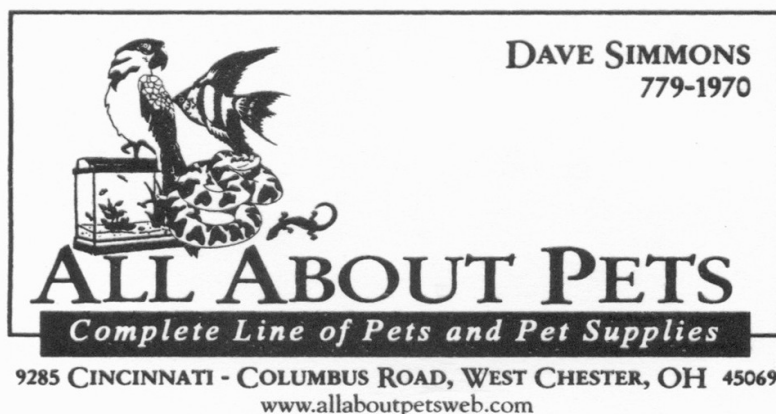
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
