The meetings usually include a program or a guest speaker, and a fry auction for the Breeders Award Program. Guests are welcome to attend any two of these meetings before joining GCAS.

Breeding *Amphilophus* Sp. Red Isletas by John Sipes

I obtained my group of four in March of 2010 from Jeff Rapps, Tangled up in cichlids.

Jeff is an exclusive importer for the beautiful barred Midas type cichlid. Very little information can be found on the net in regards to this fish. They are very much shaped as a Midas with a grey body and black bold bars. The unique feature these fish offer is a red color to the head. This coloration is not constant, but pronounces when the fish is spawning. They boast a large Nuchal hump when water conditions are favorable.. The temperament of this cichlid can be compared to that of a Midas or red devil. They are very robust and are not in the least bit shy. Needless to say I was very excited to have obtained these fish and very hopeful to spawn them.

I quickly set them up in a 180 for grow-out and as they matured I split the largest male and female to a 125 decorated with flower pots and 4inch clay pipes. I use a single 30" power compact light and sponge filters provide the filtration. Since I have horrible well water with high iron content (another story in it's own). I choose to perform water changes monthly at about 30 percent. They were feed sinking pellets twice daily. Sometime around June of 2010 they decided to spawn in one of the clay pipes with the female laying about a baseball size mass of eggs. Within days I have wigglers and within a week free swimming fry. Since this fish is not so popular in the hobby I decided to "steal" a net full of fry to spread through the club. Keep in mind it is never good or pleasant on the female to take all the fry, so about 60 or so were left behind. I moved the fry into a 55 gallon to grow-out. This was not a good move on my part, I lost all the fry and the parents ate all the fry left in their tank. Over the next 3-4 months they would spawn, eat the eggs, eat the wigglers or free swimmers. Fast

forward to May of 2011. I decided to add another female to the mix and try to re-bond the breeding pair. At this time I removed the sand substrate added a couple more clay pipes. Also last year I did not heat the tanks, I changed that when I was able to find heater in bulk. Water temp was around 72, water changes were slacking at monthly and still feeding twice daily. Shortly after June the male courted the females and picked the female he spawned with last year, so the other female was netted out quickly. Over the next couple of days I would check on the pair and be delighted to find the female fanning the eggs. Right around the 4th day I noticed the eggs had hatched and a small cluster of wigglers in the tube, yes they didn't eat the eggs. I continued to feed lightly and monitor the wigglers. Around the 10th day I noticed the wigglers up and free swimming and decided that around the 20th day I would try to take some of the fry. I moved out an oddball male from a 10 gallon and transported the fry on the 20th day. The adults still had about 15 or so fry swimming about the tank.

The fry are feed decap. Brine shrimp eggs and a powder pellet mix that is commercially prepared. The tank is kept at 72 dg and filter via a sponge. This tank also has a great deal of algae growth that the fry feed off of between feedings. The fry are very hardy and grow fairly fast. The adult pair spawned again as I write this article and I am awaiting them to reach the age where I can pull them out.

I highly recommend this fish and would suggest a tank not smaller than a 75 and 100 or bigger suites them best. I have 3 pairs currently, the breeding pair in a 125 and 2 pairs in a 150. Out of the other two pairs one male has formed his Nuchal hump and courts the female regularly. The other male has no Nuchal hump and seldom courts the other female. I am hoping the dominant male in this tank and female start breeding sometime within the next month. I will be submitting fry to the Greater Cincinnati Aquarium Societies B.A.P. program so that other hobbyist can enjoy these wonderful cichlids.

Trip to the Tennessee Aquarium by Steve Smith

The Tennessee Aquarium is a six hour trip from northern Cincinnati and well worth the trip.

The aquarium actually is divided between two buildings and both buildings are so big that it is difficult to get a picture. The buildings rise above the surrounding trees and buildings as shown below. The River Journey building is tall and upon entering, the longest escalator I have ever seen takes the riders up and up some more and up some more. Then a few more steps gets you up to the top of the building. You start at the top and walk down the pathways from one end of the building to the other. There are two long rows of aquariums and the pathways spiral down the length of them both on the inside and down the outsides of the large aquariums. Some of the aquariums are approximately one story high while others are multiple stories and you might be seeing the top of an aquarium on one trip and on the next lower walkway be seeing the lower portion of the aquarium. After a number of trips back and forth I looked over the railing upwards and realized we had come down a few levels but looking downwards I realized we had a lot more to go. It is incredible how deep some of the tanks are and then to realize that they are just one tank in a stack of tanks one above the other. The engineering to accomplish this is impressive.

We saw divers cleaning the tanks who took the time to swim over to the glass to wave to visitors and pose for pictures. Actually they invited people over to the outside of the tanks to take pictures along side with them.

In the second building, named the Ocean Journey, the large ocean tank is by my estimate at least 30 feet deep and there are windows that go from top to bottom of the tank. In addition there are windows on individual walk levels and windows that look upwards from below, etc.

We spent several hours in the two aquariums buildings and shot a lot of pictures some of which follow in the next few pages.

There are a large number of companies that run river sight seeing trips on the Tennessee river and an associated IMax theater, so filling a day visit was easy.

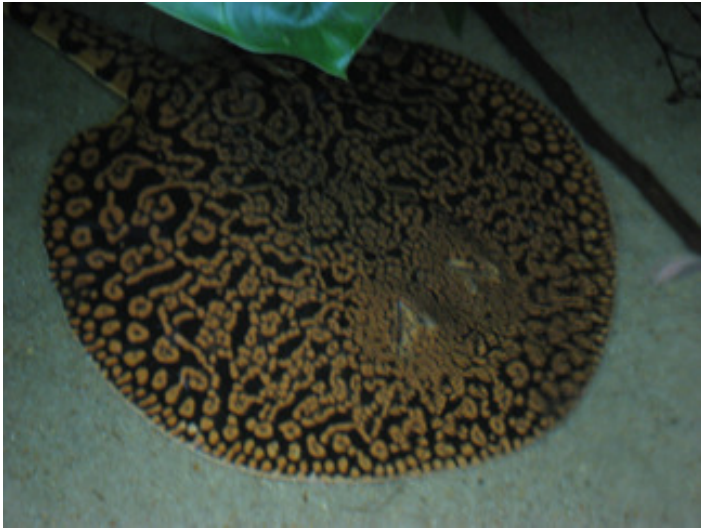

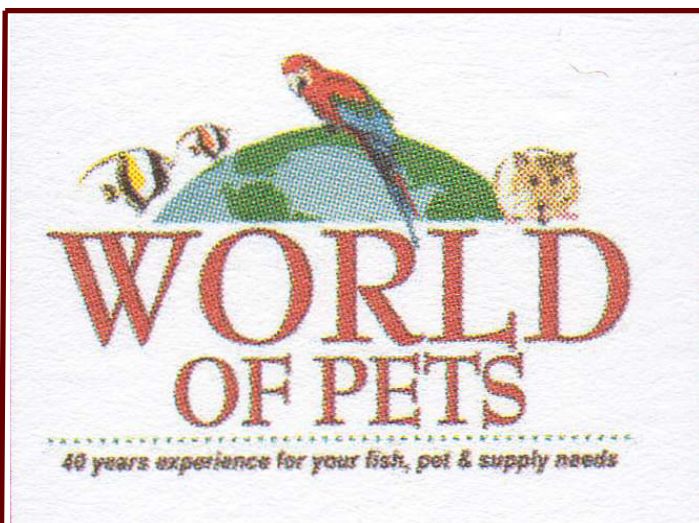

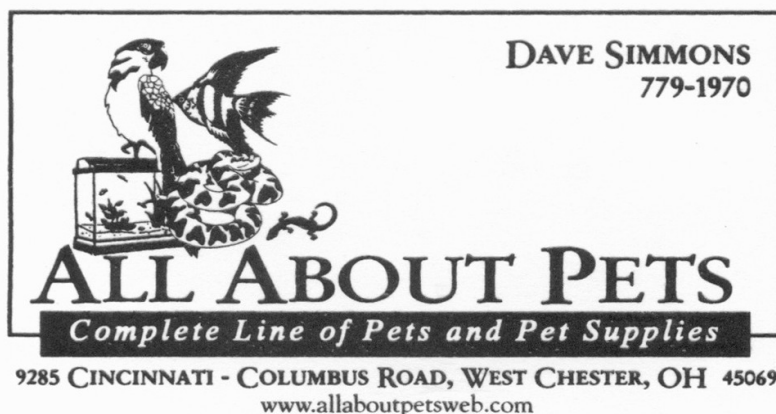
