





President's Message

with **Mark Nelson**

Many of us don't like to market, preferring to let someone else create the marketing opportunities. Over the years, one consistent member comment I have heard is the association needs to do a better job of helping members and bull customers market Braunvieh. My standard response is that marketing is really the responsibility of those who raise what they are selling. The association offers promotion to help members in marketing – the National Braunvieh Sale, online sales, USDA Process Verified Programs, RFD-TV programs, the Braunvieh World, and booths at both the Houston



Livestock Show International Room and National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Trade Show.

Considering our membership and staff size, this is impressive and a legitimate response. However, the marketing question is a good question meriting more than my political answer. To understand where we need to go, we must look at where we have been.

The timing of Braunvieh coming to the United States was not ideal. Our breed traits and cattle were good and, 30 years ago, could have been viewed as a solution for many industry shortcomings such as maternal, disposition, frame score and marbling.

However, this is how we were received:

Exotics – We were the last Continental breed to be introduced to the U.S. cattle industry. Breeds coming before us had calving issues, as did we. But we came in about the time everybody was fed up with these calving issues, and most ranchers were moving back to easier-calving breeds. About this time ranchers were also moving away from Continentals due to maternal, size, disposition and Quality Grade shortcomings. These were not problems Braunvieh had but entering the U.S. beef industry during this mass exodus of Continental breeds was just bad timing.

Reaction time – While most Continentals got a grace period to deal with issues, because the Braunvieh breed was late to the party, our breed did not. To the credit of our breeders, we have dealt successfully with birth weight. But with Braunvieh being moderate framed we had no time to overcome yearling weight concerns, and those who stayed with Continentals did so largely because of performance benefits.

Hide color – Braunvieh came to the United States when Certified Angus Beef® and black hides were becoming very important. With Braunvieh having the wild-type color allele, they were viewed as having a "color problem." The traditional Braunvieh color was associated with dairy and discounts. To complicate this, the wild-type color gene results in brindle calves when mated to red, and chocolate calves when mated with black, bringing discounts at the sale barn.

History always leads to the present, and we still have some of those old perceptions to deal with. Our cattle are good, and we believe in them, but we are still a minority. If the rest of the industry shared our mindset, Braunvieh would be where Angus is today. But if we focus on both our customers and our cattle at the same time, we can truly make progress in market share. First, sell them what they want to buy, but make sure cattle can deliver and are so good they can't live without them the next time.

Here is how we do that:

- 1. Offer only good-looking cattle in good condition. Eye appeal is cosmetic but is a lasting first impression that affects buyer acceptance.
- 2. Choose your color preference intentionally for your target customers. Be honest and informed about what your bulls' color may do on their cows, as crossbreeding is our biggest marketing opportunity.
 - a. If black bulls are what they want, breed for black and not chocolate. Remember, it's hard to make black cattle when you breed chocolate to chocolate. You need a jet-black animal on one side of mating and

preferably both sides to make truly black cattle.

- b. If they want only black calves, most any color of Braunvieh can do that if their cows are homozygous black. If they are crossbred cows, then only sell them jet-black/homozygous black bulls.
- c. If they want brindle calves, sell them traditional colored bulls; if they don't want any brindle calves, sell them homozygous black bulls.
- d. Identify customers who don't have color restrictions. We are one of the few breeds with color identity with a thriving fullblood market. When you put a traditional hide on your cattle, make sure it's on good ones because this truly represents all of us.
- 3. Breed cattle that compete against your competitors' breeds. Pay attention to EPDs, contemporary ratios and bull-test data. Fully utilize the BAA Performance Option Program (POP) to contribute to better EPDs. Make sure you are not passing on anything that will contribute high birth weights, low growth or poor fertility. Braunvieh is uniquely positioned to have a GrowSafe Efficiency EPD before everyone else; capitalize on this.
- 4. Promote and protect our strengths. Braunvieh is a unique breed. We don't want to become another breed, but a preferred industry option. Marbling/muscle, maternal/carcass, longevity, disposition, milk, adaptability, efficiency and moderate size are our strengths to maintain. Focus on marketing maternal benefits and make Braunvieh the industry standard for females.
- 5. Functional cattle bring repeat buyers. Cull hard on feet, structure, disposition, udders, etc. These are not breed traits and should not be allowed. Selling one problem animal will prevent at least 10 possible sales.

If you want to be a seedstock producer and sell cattle successfully to others, this requires some things to do your breed justice.

It has been my pleasure to serve as your president the last year and thank you to the many who have contributed to the efforts of the BAA! **BW**

Quail Pass Genetics

How Using Their Competitive Advantage Has Grown Their Braunvieh Seedstock Business

As an 8-year-old boy, Andrew Gunnett began raising and showing Braunvieh cattle. Now a young producer, he and his parents, Bob and Deanna, own and operate Quail Pass Genetics, a seedstock Braunvieh operation near Billings, Mo.

The Gunnett family has a long line of agricultural heritage. As a sixthgeneration family farm, Quail Pass Genetics became a Missouri Century Farm in 2002. Gunnett's great-greatgreat grandparents, Frederich and Amelia Kruger Bohm, purchased the farm in 1902. They had immigrated to the United States in 1872 from Germany and settled in Billings, Mo. Like many farms of this era in southwest Missouri, the work was very labor intensive, and the family tradition of hard work has been instilled in every generation of the operation.

Up until 2001, their cattle production was primarily a small commercial cow-calf operation. In the fall of 2001, the Gunnetts purchased their first fullblood Braunvieh bull and bred cow from Lane & Lane Braunvieh.

"We were looking for a breed of cattle for their docility, hybrid vigor and growth," Gunnett says. "I was also looking for a smaller breed association to show in. I showed my first Braunvieh heifer in 2002 and have never looked back."

Andrew started showing at the junior level, and his first Junior Nationals was the third annual show. He has attended almost every one since then. He served two terms on the

Junior Braunvieh Association Board of Directors, including as president. Andrew was honored to be named Junior Herdsman of the Year at the 2015 Junior Nationals. He is now a member of the Missouri Braunvieh Association and Braunvieh Association of America.

After graduating high school, Andrew attended Drury University in Springfield, Mo., and earned his Bachelor of Science in biology. He started veterinary school at University of Missouri, but decided to take a break from school to work on the family operation. Now, he is planning to start a master's program in animal nutrition or reproduction.

As Quail Pass Genetics grew, they began selling seedstock genetics. While they care about the maternal and production traits, carcass and performance traits for their bulls are just as important.

"We currently sell five to 10 bulls a year," Gunnett says. "We are focusing on quality, not quantity, and we are being very selective with the genetics we keep and sell. We also have to be diligent on our record keeping and tracking our performance data."

They have been using artificial insemination (AI) and embryo transfer (ET) with their cows. They have five or six donor-quality cows that they are flushing and putting embryos in recipient cows. In 2019, they plan to lease 50-60 more recipient cows to transfer embryos into in order to improve their genetics more quickly.

"I want to grow our operation up to 500-750 cows," Gunnett says. "My

goal is to grow all of our calves from the cow all the way to the packer."

Currently, the Gunnetts group together and feed out calves in their own facility, custom feeding their calves then selling them for a premium. It also gives them a competitive advantage with their customers to buy back calves that source back to their raised genetics.

"We started a buy-back program in which we offer to all of our bull customers that if they purchase a bull, we will buy back all of their calves at market premium," Gunnett adds.

With improved genetics, the Gunnetts have seen their calves perform better on the rail.

"Since we are offering to buy back calves sired out of our bulls, we carefully track performance traits so we are breeding for not only production but carcass and growth," Gunnett says.

While Gunnett started showing as a junior member, he has continued to show past his JBAA days, even winning some grand championships.

"It's not a big part of our business, it's more for fun, but I have enjoyed the competition and just want to keep showing," Gunnett says.

Quail Pass Genetics focuses their seedstock promotion by looking to commercial producers to buy their Braunvieh bulls and using their competitive advantage with their buyback program of those bulls' progeny.

"I don't know any other Braunvieh producers buying back and feeding out calves themselves," Gunnett says.

They focus on selling their bulls private treaty and also sell a few select females when they can. In the future, they'd like to have an annual female and bull sale.

Andrew recognizes that there can be challenges when trying to grow a business, especially financial challenges as a young producer. Optimal animal health is also top of mind for him, so he is mindful to have a good relationship with his veterinarian, who happens to live a half mile down the road.

"I have learned so much through the years, thanks to our Braunvieh cattle and other Braunvieh breeders," Gunnett says. "Braunvieh [is] such a versatile breed of cattle in crossbreeding and carcass traits – these certain traits have kept us in the breed." **BW**



Joel Walters, 57, of Fort Worth, Texas, passed from this life into the






