Minister of Education, Stephen Lecce has announced that all publicly funded schools will remain closed until at least May 31. The extension is based on the advice of the Chief Medical Officer of Health and the COVID-19 Command Table to ensure the safety of families, students and staff. Catholic Education Week May 3-8

While this initiative is an integral part of the faith life in our school board throughout the entire school year, during this special week, we highlight what Catholic Education means. As Trustees, we are stewards and advocates of Catholic education for our students. This year's theme, *"Igniting Hope"* reminds us that publicly funded Catholic education is a call to service. We come together as 29 Ontario Catholic school boards and 500 publicly funded Catholic schools across the Archdiocese of Toronto. We are thankful our Catholic schools foster an environment rooted in our call to love and serve, inspired by our Catholic faith. This year's celebration focuses on an online social media campaign called **#MyCatholicSchool**. We are asking students, staff, parents/guardians, trustees and alumni to reflect on **"What do you love about your Catholic school?"** or **"How are you or your Catholic school igniting hope in your community?"** and share their thoughts through posts, pictures and videos on Twitter, Facebook and Instagram using the hashtags **#MyCatholicSchool** and **#DPCDSB_IgnitingHope**. Student Spotlight

I want to recognize some of the innovative efforts in which our students have demonstrated this year's theme of "Igniting Hope". Education in action means we are empowering responsible citizens, who are responding critically and with compassion to promote the sacredness of human life. Our students are a beautiful reminder that we can ignite hope, in everything we do. We are so proud of the ways they are giving back and helping our communities.

- **Chalk Walk** – DPCDSB students, Rhaya and Bailey shared their talents creating sidewalk chalk drawings of Disney characters for Mississauga residents. Their story is featured in the [Mississauga News](#).
- **Food Bank** – DPCDSB student, Ciara, donated funds raised to Eden Food for Change. She has asked her neighbours for a toonie and food donations and her family delivered the goods to the food bank.
- **3D Printing** – DPCDSB student, Giuseppe, used a 3D printer to make face shields for frontline healthcare workers during the Covid-19 pandemic. He has donated more than 100 personal protective equipment shields he has made, to our local hospitals Credit Valley Hospital and Trillium Healthcare.

Continuity of Catholic Learning – We are working together to provide the best Catholic education possible for the thousands of students entrusted in our care. Distance Learning opportunities continue to be provided for all students. The relationship between school and home is as important, as ever before. We have created a [Parent/Guardian Guide for the Continuity of Catholic Learning](#) phase. This document provides clarification and context regarding teacher-led distance learning. It has already been sent to DPCDSB parents and guardians through our board wide School Messenger email system. It is also available on the DPCDSB website.

Contact Your School – We encourage you to continue to communicate with your school’s teachers and administrators to ensure your child(ren) have what they need to be successful. School offices have established an email address for parents/guardians to contact, if you have any questions. Please check the DPCDSB website www.dpccdsb.org and select “Contact Your School” for your school information. School email addresses and phone numbers can also be found on the top section of each school’s website. You can still call your school and leave a phone message. School secretaries continue to monitor both email and phone messages on a regular basis. If you have been provided with an alternative contact method for your child's teacher (i.e. Google Classroom), you can send curriculum related inquiries directly to your child(ren)’s teacher.

Technology Deployment – In addition to 11,000 chrome books purchased by DPCDSB for all Grade 7 and 8 students, we successfully deployed over 7,000 electronic devices to families that required them. In response to the Students Needs Assessment Survey communicated to all DPCDSB families, the technology needs identified across the system enabled us to engage students in Continuity of Catholic Learning at home, during this health emergency. With a tight timeline of just four days, collaborative efforts between ICT, Maintenance/Custodial, Research, Legal and Instructional departments, including all school administrators and educators made this significant board-wide endeavor possible. My thanks extend to everyone involved who, in true Dufferin-Peel spirit, helped us navigate this important learning journey together.

2020-2021 Budget – The DPCDSB continues to work on 2020-2021 Budget Development. The first report was presented to Trustees at the April 14 Administration and Finance Committee meeting. We are still waiting for the release of the Grants for Student Needs (GSN) documents from the Ministry of Education. We expect the GSN announcement by the Ministry of Education this month.

Our Public Budget Consultation for the 2020-2021 Budget is different this year. We recognize that live webcasts have provided an opportunity for Catholic School Councils to gather and provide input. It continues to be imperative that DPCDSB staff and community members adhere to recommendations from Public Health Authorities around social distancing and staying home. Therefore, during the school closure, the live Public Budget Consultation Webcast has been cancelled. We are also aware that the most immediate concerns and issues for parents/guardians are around COVID-19 and the continuity of their child(ren) learning. In that regard and, in place of a live webcast, a recorded presentation is posted to our website and has been widely circulated. The presentation provides relevant 2020-2021 information and invites input from parents/guardians and community stakeholders via a short survey that is attached. Enrolment Data – The DPCDSB Long-term Facilities Master Plan (LTFMP) was presented at our Administration and Finance Committee Meeting on April 14. Overall, we are expecting a net enrolment decline of approximately - 2.1% over the next ten years. The anticipated growth over the ten years for the elementary panel is approximately 1.2% and the expected decline for the secondary panel is -7.43%. The City of Mississauga continues to see an overall enrolment decline. The LTFMP will reflect the enrolment changes through the recommendation of new pupil places, either through new schools or additions to schools, through the realignment of school boundaries, program changes and pupil accommodation reviews once new Pupil Accommodation Review Guidelines are released by the Ministry of Education. Holy Name of Mary Catholic Secondary – On April 3, the Government of Ontario updated the list of essential businesses that can remain open, to reduce contact between people and stop the spread of COVID-19. As construction of new schools has not been deemed an essential service, these projects are on hold indefinitely. As a result of this direction, the DPCDSB has been advised by the general contractor of the Holy Name of Mary CSS project, that construction is suspended until further notice. DPCDSB has arranged for ongoing security for the site during the suspension of activities. We anticipate all timelines associated with new construction projects will be impacted by the provincial orders. The temporary relocation of those students at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Catholic Learning Centre will be extended into the 2020-2021 school year. Families and staff have been notified and will have the opportunity to move back to the Brampton site, as soon as the safe resumption of construction allows.

Essential Services – We extend heartfelt thanks to all healthcare professionals and those working in essential services during COVID-19. We know many of you are parents and caregivers and are working hard to keep our community safe and healthy. You are our community health heroes and we are grateful for you. DPCDSB is proud to have contributed 125,550 pairs of gloves and 330 face shields from our school inventory of personal protective equipment. These items have been donated to the Ministry of Government and Consumer Services to distribute to the healthcare and essential social services sectors across Ontario during COVID-19. I also express our condolences to those of you who have lost loved ones during this time. My thoughts and prayers are with you.

The Archdiocese of Toronto – Our Catholic faith continues to be a source of strength and hope during challenging and uncertain times. Raising children in the Catholic faith can be especially difficult during difficult times. While our churches remain closed, connectivity to our parish communities feels different for everyone. We are grateful that many of our local priests are providing their mass celebrations online.
