This month's virtue of EMPATHY reminds us of the dignity in ourselves, and the ability to recognize it in others. As a Catholic community, we believe that the cross is the ultimate sign of compassion and forgiveness.

Catholic Education Week: Each year, the Ontario Catholic School Trustees Association (OCSTA) sponsors the provincial-wide initiative, Catholic Education Week. With 29 Catholic school boards in Ontario and 500 publicly funded Catholic schools across the Archdiocese of Toronto, this initiative is an integral part of the faith life of the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB). OCSTA develops resources for our schools and communities to use throughout the entire school year. This year's Catholic Education Week theme is inspired by three sources:

- 1. The recent Papal Exhortation, Christus Vivit, by Pope Francis following the 2018 Synod of Bishops on Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment;
- 2. The recent Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario's pastoral letter, Renewing the Promise (2018);
- 3. The Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations by the Institute of Catholic Education (2011)

Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP): The anchor theme of Catholic Education Week ties into both the DPCDSB's Catholic Board Improvement Learning Cycle (CBILC), in the focus on Scripture and Catholic Social Teaching, and the five-priority Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP) framework that Trustees approved under the first core principle "Believe". The following five areas were approved: (1) Believe (2) Excel (3) Respect (4) Thrive (5) Trust. These represent the five core values of the DPCDSB, reflecting our core commitment to Catholic education. These values align with the Ministry of Education's key priorities included in its recently released vision: Education that Works for You (focusing on Modern Classrooms, Modern Learning and Health and Physical Education). The 2019-2023 MYSP also supports DPCDSB in identifying opportunities for future growth. The implementation of the new MYSP will influence our education system, including programs, facility management and careful stewardship of available resources (e.g. Long-Term Facilities Master Plan).

Catholic Board Improvement Learning Cycle (CBILC): The 2018-2019 CBILC is based on the Strategic System Plan 2014-2019 with its seven core principles. In general, the following observations were made:

- Progress in EQAO literacy assessments has remained stable at high levels of achievement.
- A high degree of personalized instruction and support for critical thinking in literacy among educators.
- Among students in Grades 4 through 12, a majority report high competence in literacy problem solving and writing strategies.
- Math survey data indicates high integration of practices that support student math communication and use of
 manipulatives and technology. There is still room for improvement regarding strategies to help students
 construct knowledge, create rich tasks and meet individual student needs.
- Social, academic and intellectual engagement, as well as social, physical and cyber interaction among students in Grades 4 through 12 are areas that can benefit from some focus.
- Student application of scripture, sacrament and Catholic social teaching in daily life are other areas of focused efforts to improve.
- Local parish priests were pleased with the opportunity to provide input about DPCDSB schools. Most priests surveyed felt DPCDSB schools are welcoming, easy to communicate with and responsive to pastors' concerns.

The 2019-2020 CBILC represents the first CBILC aligned with the five values of the new 2019-2023 MYSP. This includes: (1) identification of operational goals for each of the five values of the MYSP; (2) action steps to achieve the goals; and (3) identification of data and evidence for monitoring the goals.

Goals include student, staff, and/or community outcomes. The data used to monitor the CBILC are collected through a number of system-level surveys and other feedback strategies to ensure decisions are evidence-informed. Every effort is made to spread the surveys and other feedback mechanisms throughout the year to reduce stress on the schools. At the local level, school administrators develop the Catholic School Improvement Learning Cycle (CSILC). Each CSILC incorporates CBILC goals, with school administrators providing school-specific responses and action plans to support attainment of these goals.

September 2019 represented the end of the Trustees' *Strategic System Plan 2014-2019*, and the beginning of the *Multi-Year Strategic Plan 2019-2023*. OAPCE Consultation: The Ontario Association of Parents in Catholic Education (OAPCE) has launched an online consultation for parents. The Ontario government has made several changes over the past year in publicly funded education. OAPCE now seeks a consult with parents as to their concerns regarding these issues.
