A Message from Carol O'Dell, President



This is a **BIG** year for our guild! This year, we are celebrating our 40th anniversary. The official celebration party will be in June, with games and who would have guessed, a 24" guilt challenge.

As I thought about what I was going to do, of course I perused the internet to see what "struck my fancy". After a while, I gave up and went to my magazines and books. There, I found what I was looking for. Many years ago, there was a woman who collected red and white quilts. She would gather them from wherever she found them. Flea markets, garage sales and the like. Often, they were used to wrap purchases, until such time came that someone would see the beauty and skill it took to put these quilts together. Over the years, she collected 651 quilts from 3 centuries. In fact, initially she didn't even know how many she had.

Her husband asked her what she wanted for her 80th birthday. Her reply was, "Something I've not seen before and something that would be a gift for New York City". So, for her birthday, her husband along with the American Folk Art Museum, Thinc Design and the Park Avenue Armory, her quilts we hung in the Park Avenue Armory for all to view and appreciate. No admission fees were charged. It was open to all. Admission records were set that week.

These 651 quilts were hung from the ceiling, 4 and 5 deep. They were placed in special viewing boxes and some were displayed on chairs in the middle of the exhibit. It was an incredible work of red and white quilts.

I cannot believe this occurred 13 years ago. If you ever have a chance to look through the book, "Red & White Quilts Infinite Variety" presented by the American Folk Art Museum, take the time to enjoy all that is contained within the pages. Why do I bring this up? Because we, too, are going to have our own little "red and white quilt show" at our June guild meeting.

Please don't miss the opportunity to participate in this very special time for our guild. I cannot wait to see what our members present at that meeting. It will be an incredible time!
