Quilt Show FAQs

1. Do I need a Google account to use the online Quilt Registration form?

Yes, you do need a Google account to use the online Quilt Registration form, but you do **not** need a Google gmail address.

2. Do our quilts need to be finished by the January 15th deadline?

No. The January 15th deadline only applies to the Registration Forms. If your quilt is not finished at the time you register, there is a box on the form which you can check.

3. What quilts will be judged?

ALL the quilts will be judged, **EXCEPT** Category 14 which is the Anniversary Quilts, and Category 17 which is the Found and Finished Quilts.

4. Will we receive written feedback from the judge?

No. Written feedback is very time-consuming and would require 2 judges.

They are Alice Ridge Quilts, Andrea's Creative Expressions – jewelry from vintage tableware, Carol Ann's Candies, Dyeing for a New Career - hand dyed fabrics, Kentuckiana Country Quilts, Mary Winegar - repurposed vintage fabrics and textiles, Old Master Pen Shoppe, Roberts Sewing Center, Robin Ruth Barn Quilts, Warman Cozy, and Yellow Creek Quilts.

Create a quilt inspired by your favorite book – one that has impacted your life, whether from your childhood, one you have read to a child or simply a book that holds special meaning to you.

Size: No larger than 36" x 48"

Techniques: Any, as long as it is made <u>entirely</u> by you, the member. Including the quilting & binding.
