Quilt Show 2023

We are 4 months away from our show! IT IS GOING TO HAPPEN!! It seems like an eternity since our last show and at times we wondered if, and when, it would happen again. But, here we are.

The Quilt Show Registration Form is now on the website. If you haven't been there in awhile, it is <u>www.prideofprairie.org</u>. Jan has done a lovely job showcasing our quilt on the home page. Towards the right, there is a tab just for Quilt Show. Click on that tab and a drop down list will appear. The registration form is one of the items listed there. You can open it and print it. Don't forget a couple of important items:

- 1. Quilt Show Registration Forms are due at the January 19, 2023 meeting. If you can't attend, please give them to a friend who can. No late forms will be accepted!!
- 2. When turning in your registration forms, you must turn in 2 copies.
- 3. If making a challenge quilt, you need a registration form and pillowcase for that quilt as well as each of the other entries.
- 4. Please choose your category carefully. Think about all of the different types of work you've put into each quilt and mark the category accordingly. Sometimes, just moving it from 1 category to another might increase your chances of garnering a ribbon.
- 5. We love to display ALL skill levels. We've all started somewhere and a simpler quilt might be just the thing to help a new quilter get started.

Our Opportunity Quilt has been seen in many places and we've had a good response by our members to take our quilt. We are still needing some volunteers to display the quilt in quilt stores. Please see Melanie Hinds about getting your name on the list. What a great way to show off our lovely quilt and spend time in a quilt store, enjoying what they have to offer.

We've had quite a few opportunities to visit other quilt shows in the area. In fact, in two weeks is the quilt show for Morris at a church in Channahon. As you visit these shows, please take a look at how they display their quilts. Do they have a silent auction, opportunity baskets, an area to get food? Who are their vendors that caught your eye? These questions, and answers, are important to us as we plan and prepare for our show. If there is a vendor that especially catches your eye, would you be so kind as to give that information to Sharon Thomsen? 2023 Quilt Show Quilt Challenge

- Quilt must be made entirely by the member (pieced, appliqued, quilted and bound with a label on the back.)
