January 18,2024 – Sarah Goer "Creating a Scrappy Slab" virtual lecture/demo. Get your scraps out of your scrap bin and into a project! In this lecture/demo, Sarah will demonstrate her techniques for building a scrappy slab from scrap fabrics of any size. In addition to show and tell about numerous projects using these slabs, Sarah will outline a variety of ways for you to use scrappy slabs in your quilting. You will leave this virtual lecture/demo ready to sew your own scrappy slabs. This will be a Zoom meeting that you can watch from the comfort of your home.

<u>February 15, 2024 – Eileen Uchima Roll up for the Mystery Tour!</u> Consider this an invitation to join Eileen for a Magical Mystery quilt. For the next six months we will be working on a mystery quilt, designed just for Pride of the Prairie by member, designer, and teacher, Eileen Uchima.

In February, Eileen will present a talk on the history and process of designing her original Block of the Month quilts.
