To become a

Confident Communicator

We sharing stories, singing rhymes, modelling language, vocabulary introduced, opportunities to talk, be listened too, listening to others, talking boxes, role play, asking for help, go on listening walks,

To become a

Independent Individual

We use predictable routine, resources available to access, supported to make choices, looking after own belongings through routines, hanging up own coat & bag, tray for artwork etc.. to take home, supported to dress ones self, put on own shoes, coats etc.. supported to use the toilet. Supported to make healthy food choices.

To become a

Fabulous Friend

We explain feelings in the moment and through stories, role modelling what a good friend looks like, saying please & thank you, asking someone to join in the play, sharing resources, saying sorry, offering comfort or help. To become a

Motivated Mover

We provide opportunities to move in different ways, physical activities inside & outside, music and dancing, obstacle courses, using equipment such as scooters and bikes, threading pasta, using tongs, tweezers and hammers,

Competent Coordinator

We support the use of scissors, using jugs to pour their own drinks, tongs to pick up fruit, and scoops to measure cereal into a bowl, using tools to make changes in playdough, sand etc...

Super Storyteller

Share a wide range of stories, we predict ending, create our own stories, engage in imaginative play, role play and share songs, act out stories,

Magnificent Mark Maker

Provide opportunities to make marks with paint, playdough and sand, using brushes, tools and sticks, large and small creations are encouraged, scarves and ribbons are used to make large arm movements.

We sing counting songs, share stories involving counting, we provide lots of real-life opportunities to match quantities, sharing resources between children, filling and pouring activities, finding numbers and shapes in the environment,
