It'ssssss TIME!

The sun is out and along with our furkids enjoying the warm weather, so are SNAKES! The Cornell College of Veterinary Medicine has an article about what to do if a cat is bit by a snake. While this is about cats, the symptoms for canine and feline are very similar.



The initial symptoms are often swelling and pain, with weeping tissue at the site of the bite, with other signs such as tremors, vomiting, diarrhea, dilated pupils, and/or paralysis may develop depending upon the species of snake involved.

Immediate treatment is critical, even for non-venomous snake bites, as these can become infected with bacteria, leading to an abscess.

It's best to keep cats inside and supervise dogs while outside... a really good practice at anytime.
