Referrals to clinical settings for individuals involved with child sexual exploitation material continue to rise. This has led to greater demand for valid risk assessment as clinicians seek methods to identify individuals at relatively greater risk of reoffending, to tailor their interventions and risk management options according to the Risk and Need principles of correctional rehabilitation.
