
## A Comprehensive Guide to Ticks


One such risk is tick-borne encephalitis (TBE), a viral infection transmitted by ticks. In this guide, we will provide information about ticks, tickborne encephalitis, and steps to prevent and manage tick bites.



## Overview of Ticks in Almaty

- Ticks are small, blood-sucking arachnids commonly found in wooded and grassy areas.
- Ticks can **transmit** various **diseases**, including tick-borne encephalitis, which is prevalent in the region.

Tick-borne encephalitis (TBE) is an acute infectious viral disease that primarily affects the central nervous system, and its consequences can range from full recovery to health disorders leading to disability and death.



The most active period for ticks in Almaty is from April to September, with the highest activity in May and June.

# TBE is an acute infectious viral disease

Infection can occur through visiting endemic areas for TBE, being in contact with animals or objects carrying ticks, consuming raw milk from infected goats, sheep, or cows, and through skin contact with the virus when crushing ticks or scratching the bite area.

Symptoms include fever, chills, severe headaches, high temperature, nausea, vomiting, and muscle pain.

People of all ages and genders are susceptible to tick-borne encephalitis.

Those who spend time in forests, such as forestry workers, geologists, construction workers, hunters, and **tourists**, **are at higher risk of infection**.

### Protection measures against tick bites include:

- do not sit or lay down on grass
- vaccination
- wearing light-colored clothing
- tucking pants into socks
- using repellents
- regular checks for ticks on clothes and the body.

### Vaccination is an effective way to prevent tick-borne encephalitis.





### You got bitten. Now what?

If a tick attaches itself to you, it is important to seek immediate medical attention at healthcare facilities (trauma centers) where you can receive qualified medical assistance and determine the need for emergency seroprophylaxis (administration of immunoglobulin against tick-borne encephalitis within 96 hours of tick attachment).

DO NOT:

- X REMOVE THE TICK YOURSELF
- X TRY TO CRUSH THE TICK

If you have scratches or cuts on your hands, the virus can enter your bloodstream.

## To remove a tick

ONLY if medical help is unavailable within 96 hours, you need to remove the tick very carefully to avoid breaking off its "mouth", which is deeply and strongly embedded. When removing a tick, follow these recommendations:

Grasp the tick with tweezers or fingers wrapped in clean gauze as close as possible to its mouthparts and hold it strictly perpendicular to the bite surface. Rotate the tick's body around its axis and extract it from the skin.

Disinfect the bite area with a suitable solution (70% alcohol or 5% iodine) DO NOT USE COLOGNE!

After removing the tick, thoroughly **wash** your **hands** with **soap**.

The removed **tick can be examined** in the **laboratory** of especially dangerous infections branch of the "National Expertise Center".



### How to avoid bites?

• Wear long-sleeved shirts, long pants, and closed-toe shoes when in wooded or grassy areas. Use insect repellents on exposed skin

### Can we still have fun outside?

Yes, but regularly check yourself, children, and pets for ticks after spending time outdoors.

### What to do if bitten by a tick?

Seek immediate medical attention at a local healthcare facility or trauma center. Do not attempt to remove or crush the tick yourself.

### What to expect at the hospital?

You get examined by a doctor and may need an emergency Seroprophylaxis (administration of immunoglobulin against tick-borne encephalitis).
