
Human Relations Day—Jan. 19, 2025

Question & Answer with Dr. Amy-Jill Levine

Sunday, January 19th at 9 a.m. during Adult Sunday School

Dr. Amy-Jill Levine is a Rabbi Stanley M. Kessler Distinguished Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at <u>Hartford</u> <u>International University for Religion and Peace</u>. She works in <u>biblical studies</u> and is a self described "critic of anti-semitic, sexist, and homophobic theologies". She is an accomplished author of multiple books, educational books, videos, and commentaries.

A self-described "Yankee Jewish feminist who teaches in a predominantly Protestant divinity school in the buckle of the Bible Belt," Levine "combines historical-critical rigor, literary-critical sensitivity, and a frequent dash of humor with a commitment to eliminating anti-semitic, sexist, and homophobic theologies." She is a member of the Orthodox Jewish synagogue Sherith Israel, though she herself does not observe kashrut or Shabbat according to Orthodox Jewish norms. Levine has produced lectures on the Old Testament and "Great Figures of the New Testament" for The Teaching Company.

Dr. Levine will join the EUMC Adult Sunday School class on Zoom to answer questions regarding her current book they are studying, "Jesus for Everyone: Not Just Christians" and any other questions that the group may have.

WHAT IS HUMAN RELATIONS DAY?

Human Relations Day is a special Sunday across our denomination, focused on fostering better relationships and supporting community and youth outreach. On the Sunday before Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday, we take up a special offering to help bring his vision of a "beloved community" to life. Your gifts support important programs like Community Developers, United Methodist Voluntary Services, and Youth Offender Rehabilitation. We invite you to give through your local church or online, helping us continue this vital work together.

Thanks to your generosity, over **\$250,000** was raised last year to support these vital ministries through the Human Relations Day Fund Sunday offering:

Fifty-seven percent of the funds received support the Community Developers Program (CDP) that strive to maintain, and strengthen racial-ethnic minority congregations through local United Methodist churches and engage based on community needs.

Thirty-three percent of the funds received support The United Methodist Voluntary Services (UMVS) that serves as a resource to congregations and volunteer working to challenge unjust political, social, and economic systems.

Ten percent of the funds received support youth rehabilitation programs, empowering young people through church-based activities, mentoring programs, and boys' and girls' clubs.

For over 50 years, United Methodists have observed this special Sunday to honor the message Jesus lived out: that every one of God's children matters. One of the beautiful things about The United Methodist Church is that, together, we can accomplish far more than we could on our own. Our collective gifts help build "the beloved community."

Reaffirmation of Faith

Leader: Sisters and brothers in Christ: through the sacrament of baptism God's Spirit has been poured out upon water, water poured over and immersing us, water that flows freely for all who will receive it, water from the streams of God's saving power and justice, water that brings hope to all who thirst for righteousness, water that refreshes life, nurtures growth, and offers new birth.

Today we come to the waters, to renew our commitments in each other's presence to Christ who has raised us, the Spirit who has birthed us, and the Creator who is making all things new.

Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith

Leader: And so I ask you, will you turn away from the powers of sin and

death?

People: We renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, Reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of our sin!

Leader: Will you let the Spirit use you as prophets to the powers that be?

People: We accept the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves!

Leader: Will you proclaim the good news and live as disciples of Jesus Christ, his body on earth?

People: We confess Jesus Christ as our Savior, put our whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as our Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races!

Leader: Will you be living witnesses to the gospel, individually and together, wherever you are, and in all that you do?

People: We will remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world.

Leader: Will you receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

People: We affirm and teach the faith of the whole church as we put our trust in God, the Father Almighty, in Jesus Christ, his only Son, and in the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever.

Thanksgiving Over the Water

Leader: The Spirit of the Lord is with us. **People: Even so, come Lord Jesus!**

Leader: Let us pray. Almighty God, the life you birthed in us by baptism into Jesus Christ will never die. Your justice never fails. Your mercy is

everlasting.

People: Your healing river flows. Your Spirit blows where you will. We

cannot stop you, God!

Leader: But sometimes we try. We try to block the flow, we redirect the winds of the Spirit, or we walk so far away from the life-giving

stream that we do not hear its sound, and we forget its power. We

parch ourselves.

People: We are dry and thirsty, O God. Come, refresh us!

Leader: Come upon us, Holy Spirit!

People: Come upon us, Holy Spirit!

Leader: Come upon these waters. **People: Come upon these waters.**

Leader: Let these waters be to us drops of your mercy.

People: Let these waters remind us of your righteousness and justice.

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People: Let these waters make us long for your coming reign.

Leader: Most Holy God, Abba, Father!

People: Glory to you!

Leader: Jesus Christ, Savior, Lord!

People: Glory to you!

Leader: Spirit of fire, Spirit over the waters, Spirit of holiness!

People: Glory to you!

Leader: Eternal God, One in Three and Three in One!

All: All glory is yours, now and forever. Amen!
