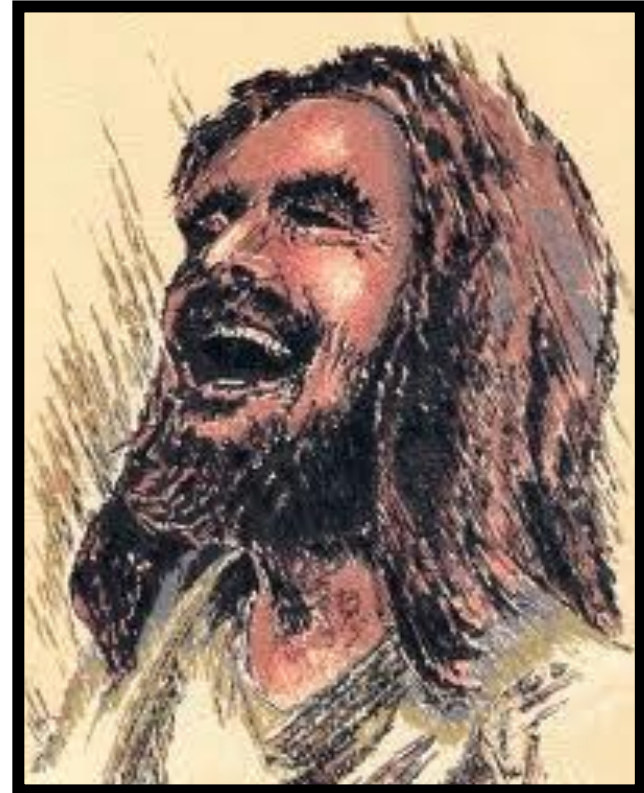

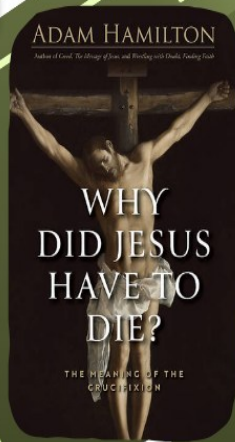

Spirit Journey Adult Sunday School **LENTEN STUDY**

When words fall short, the cross still speaks.

Despite the crucifixion's central place in Christian faith, the New Testament offers few clear answers about how Jesus' death saves, or why, exactly, he had to die. The New Testament writers use a host of metaphors—ransom, sacrifice, reconciliation, victory—but never explain exactly how it works or why it had to happen this way.

What if that's because we've been asking the wrong question? What if the cross isn't a transaction to be explained, but a living Word from God meant to transform who we are and how we live?

●●●●● **PASTOR ED'S LENTEN BOOK STUDY:** **The Cross & the Lynching Tree**

The cross and the lynching tree are separated by 2,000 years. One is the universal symbol of Christian faith; the other is the quintessential symbol of black oppression in America." One is a symbol of hope and salvation; the other, a symbol of brutal oppression, cruelty and suffering. How do we reconcile "the essential symbol of Christianity and the quintessential emblem of black suffering"? Cone wants both blacks and whites to remember, to face this macabre spectacle and learn from it, to look and live.

Our study will use a guide from the New York Conference of the United Methodist Church Board of Church and Society along with sermons and videos from Dr. Cone and other Christian Theologians and writers.



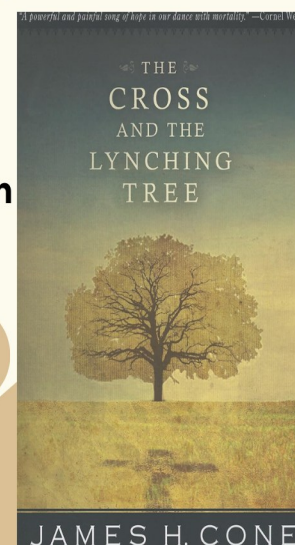

Albright-Deering Lectures in Methodist Studies

Celebrating 70 Years of Full Clergy Rights for Women in the United Methodist Church

Marking the 70th anniversary of women's ordination in the Methodist Church, this three-part lecture series explores the past, present, and future of women's leadership in Methodist ministry. From the early pioneers who preached without permission to the complex realities faced by clergywomen today, the series traces how the Holy Spirit has moved—and continues to move—through the lives and leadership of women called to serve. Through historical analysis, theological reflection, and constructive visioning, these lectures invite the church and academy alike to consider how women's ordination has shaped Methodist identity, and how it will continue to form the church's witness in the decades ahead.

The Rev. **Stephanie York Arnold**, general secretary for The General Commission on the Status and Role of Women of The United Methodist Church, and the Rev. Dr. **Emily Nelms Chastain**, assistant professor of Christian history and Methodist studies at Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University, will present the 2026 Albright-Deering Lectures.
