

Adam Hamilton is the founding pastor of The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in the Kansas City area (It is the largest United Methodist Church in the United States with over 23,000 adults and children). Adam earned a B.A. degree in Pastoral Ministry from Oral Roberts and a Master of Divinity Degree from Southern Methodist University.

Hamilton has written over 35 books including with Abingdon, Random House, Harper Collins and others. Titles include Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith, Luke: Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws, The Lord's Prayer, Seeing Gray in a World of Black and White, and Making Sense of the Bible.

Virtual Book Study


Tuesdays in October 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm
