

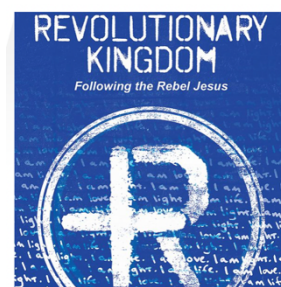
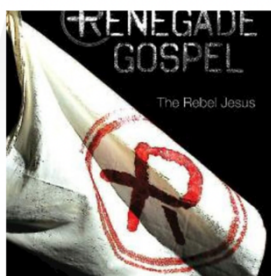
Join Us for a Visit to Ginghamburg Church Saturday June 4 – Sunday June 5
