It has become unavoidable, unfixable, and perhaps even unattainable. It helps us rationalize not doing anything about it. We can't fix it. We can't change it. We can't even ignore it. We just look at it, admit defeat, and quit.

(Funny that the spelling of the words "admit" and "quit" both include "it.")

To concede "It is what it is" means that I have admitted defeat. And that is not the "it" I want to portray! Because God is too good!

It is a good day. It is a good life. It is another opportunity to show God's love. The tough "it" in my life becomes just one more item in my witness for the Lord. And look at that! The word "witness" also includes "it!"

So, "it" must be much more important than I've realized. Every "it" is a part of my witness! Ah, the light bulb has just come on! It really is what it is! It is another chance to buckle down, let God work, and show the world what He has brought me through! Now I understand! It is what it is!
