Design Aesthetic


Minimalist colors (simple, not loud)

Influences

What design is client inspired by?

Client is inspired by minimalism, such as corbusier's Villa Savoye, with the concept of continuous glass in a ribbon style (floor to ceiling).

Simplicity of Mies Van der rohe's Barcelona Pavilion and its use of reinforced concrete.



Kazuyo Sejima was an inspiraiton for this project. This home, house in a plum grove, built by Kazuyo Sejima, the rooms are all interconnected by windows, instead of doors. The interiors wre divided into seventeen spaes whose size depends on teir assigned functions and needs.

A spiral staircase connetc the different levels tucked into four walls, as if they were another room. Windows are cutout in each room, so each person can climb into another section of the area. These openings look like frameless paintings that dcorate the walls and offer perspectives of the spaces.


Some of the rooms look into other rooms, and the idea of privacy, turns elastic. Family members can choose their place, according to their moods.















Furniture floorplan - Second Floor




Furniture floorplan - Third Floor











Rooftop Plan










This axo shows the different floors of the building.


The second and third floors shows the inside of the building, and the floors are highlighted, to emphasize the interior design of the unit.

GUEST ROOMS


The guest rooms have a similar aesthetic, with concrete walls, a minimalistic feel and walls made with glass. Floor to ceiling glass is used to allow light within the area, and sunlight to come into the room, a sort of homage to the modernistic era, where light is one of the architectural factors, allowing for people to flourish in the home, with sunlight being one of the main design factors aplied to the architectural structure.











PROJECT DETAILS

The living area is the center of the home. It is also where most of the home's technology is built into the home for convenience. The living area has minimalist colors, high-end flooring and surfaces. The minimalistic, furniture and cabinetry projects this respect for minimalism. The client is inspired by the simplicity of the villa savoye, with its long ribbon windows, and freely designed facade. Ilumination and ventilation is also a dominant design factor, which the client emphasized. Similarly, this concept was applied by Corbusier.
