As with all national elections, much attention will be paid to a handful of high-profile issues, some related to differences in approaches to governance, others to the personal qualities of the candidates. But the election will also have consequences far beyond the headlines, particularly for students. This election will help determine what students are taught, where they go to school, how they pay for college, and whether they can get a good job. Let' look at where the presidential candidates stand on education.
