Early Voting In, Voter ID Out as Democrats Pass Sweeping Election Bill

A sweeping bill to overhaul the Commonwealth's election laws has passed the Pennsylvania House. Its changes include creating in-person early voting, giving counties more time to process mail ballots, and requiring counties to use mail ballot drop boxes. But it doesn't include one provision that will likely be important to its prospects: a Voter ID requirement, something that Republicans, who control the State Senate, have always seen as crucial to any election law deal.
