# FROM SOIL TO SOLUTION: CLAUDE BROWNE SPEAKS ON FARMING CHALLENGES AND HOPE



MR. CLAUDE BROWNE PRESIDENT, MONTSERRAT FARMERS ASSOCIATION

1. Can you briefly introduce the Montserrat Farmers Association and its main objectives?

The Association brings together farmers to strengthen agricultural production, advocate for better access to inputs, and share knowledge. Our goal is to ensure farming remains viable and sustainable on-island.

### 2. What are the biggest barriers to expanding agricultural production on Montserrat?

Land access is a major issue. Many farmers want to scale up, but suitable land is limited or tied up in long-term leases. We're advocating for clearer policies and more flexible arrangements so farmers can grow without unnecessary delays.

- 3. What kinds of inputs are most difficult to access, and how does that affect farmers? Fertilizers, seeds, and livestock feed are expensive and not always available when needed. That affects planting schedules and overall productivity. We've had some support, but consistent access is still a challenge.
- 4. How are farmers working together to overcome shared challenges?

We're constantly sharing knowledge, what works, what doesn't. Some farmers pool resources to buy inputs in bulk or help each other with labor during peak seasons. That kind of collaboration is what keeps us going.

**5. Why is strengthening local agriculture important for Montserrat's food security?**We import most of our food, which makes us vulnerable to price shocks and supply chain issues. If we can grow more locally, we reduce that risk and create jobs. It's not just about farming it's about resilience.

### 6. What is the Association's long-term vision for agriculture on the island?

We want to build a resilient, self-sustaining agricultural sector one that feeds our people, creates jobs, and reduces reliance on imports. That means investing in training, infrastructure, and innovation.

7. What's the best way for supporters, especially those in the diaspora to get involved? Whether it's donating seeds, tools, or livestock feed, sharing technical know-how, or offering mentorship, every bit of support helps us grow stronger. We're eager to connect with people and organizations who believe in Montserrat's future.

### SOWING SUPPORT: SEED DONATION BOOSTS LOCAL FARMING

Village664 helped spark a meaningful partnership between Mr. David Lake of the United States and the Montserrat Farmers Association. Through this connection, over 120 packets of seeds were donated to support local agriculture, completely free of charge.

The seeds donated included a wide range of vegetables and herbs such as tomatoes, peppers, squash, lettuce, carrots, and more. Farmers and home gardeners across Montserrat were able to receive seeds by contacting the Montserrat Farmers Association directly.

This initiative reflects the spirit of Village664: building bridges that lead to real, lasting impact. By linking generous individuals with grassroots organizations, we continue to help grow a stronger, more resilient Montserrat, one seed at a time.


