Highlights from our launch

Our grand launch took place on March 14th 2024 at Good Life, Montserrat. It was a lively event that featured speeches by our team, government officials and local non-profit groups. The launch allowed us to express our mission and vision for Village664; especially that we are here to support the local non-profit groups through skills or the provision of funding. In the long term, our plan is to offer grants that these groups can apply for based on their specific projects.



Digital Transformation Project

We were excited to also share the success of our digital transformation project. This initiative included training workshops and a grant of EC\$ 4,000 towards the expansion of the 'digital map' for shops, restaurants, businesses and other attractions in Montserrat.

There were raving reviews from the attendees at the workshops. The consensus was that the knowledge shared was very helpful for future endeavours. Many local businesses were struggling with social media and connecting with their clients through the virtual sphere.

The team of young professionals who worked on the 'digital map' succeeded in

providing greater exposure for various establishments in Montserrat. Many places can now be found via a Google search or on Google maps. This will greatly assist residents and tourists alike with traversing the various villages in Montserrat and finding essential services. The team also helped to revamp the social media of several businesses. This allowed opening hours and other crucial information to be displayed in a convenient manner for clients.

Representatives from various nonprofit organizations in attendance were allowed to introduce themselves and express the main challenges currently being faced.

Some of the problems identified were funding, the need for legislation that assists NPOs, the need for skilled & dedicated volunteers and assistance with registration & grant proposals.

Our featured speaker emphasized ascertaining the value of the work provided and keeping up-to-date accounts for the organizations. She also advised that organizations should have diverse income streams - generating income and not solely dependent on grant funding.

Interview with George Thompson: Chairman of the Montserrat Financial Services Commission



1. What is your name and which board do you currently serve on?

I am George Thompson, the current Chairman of the Board of the Montserrat Financial Services Commission.

2. As someone who lives in the diaspora, was it challenging for you to become a member of this board?

With regard to being selected as a Board Member, this was not a major challenge. However, there were other minor challenges. Primarily, there were logistical issues

such as coordinating time zones to ensure that I can be available for discussions and meetings. The other challenge was juggling my own work commitments and, at the same time, demonstrating that I was committed to the task of being a Board member.

3. Are there any difficulties that you experience in fulfilling this role as someone who lives in the diaspora, as opposed to living in Montserrat?

One significant challenge is staying up-to-date with local developments in Montserrat, which requires extra effort to stay informed. Being present provides you with the 'soft intelligence'. However, thanks to social media's constant streaming of local issues and the Montserrat Government UK office in London, providing up to date credible information about what is happening - I still feel connected in some ways.

4. How has your experience been with virtual board meetings? Any challenges?

My experience with virtual board meetings has been largely positive, but not without challenges. Technical issues such as intermittent internet connectivity occasionally disrupt meetings. Virtual meetings can sometimes lack the personal interaction and rapport-building that in-person meetings foster, which is vital for effective collaboration; but once you are flexible and patient, you will succeed through these minor hiccups.

5. Has there been any requirement for you to be physically in Montserrat during your tenure?

There has been no strict requirement for physical presence in Montserrat, but there have been occasions where being on the island was beneficial for specific events or key discussions. However, I have made efforts to visit Montserrat to meet with other board members and key stakeholders in person, as my schedule permits.

6. Do you have any advice for individuals in the diaspora who are interested in becoming members of various boards in Montserrat?

My advice would be to:

- Stay informed and engaged with Montserratian affairs even while abroad.
- Build strong networks within your community and demonstrate a genuine commitment to the island's development.
- Participate in forums and discussions about Montserrat. Let people know of your interest.
- Get comfortable with virtual collaboration tools.
- Finally, don't hesitate to visit Montserrat. In-person connections can significantly enhance your effectiveness and integration into the board. If you are asked to serve, take this as a privilege and an honour to give back to the country which shaped your growth and development. It's a real privilege to be able to make this contribution.

Presentation to The Small Beginnings Music Programme






