

#### Welcome to Capital City Young Aviators (CCYA)

A central Ohio based non-profit organization, CCYA's purpose is to raise funds and to manage the community resources needed to provide this exciting opportunity to central Ohio youth. Our hope is that through flight, we can help send a message that all students, regardless of their circumstances or resources, can dream big and accomplish their goals in life, including flying and controlling a small plane over the Columbus area at over 3,000 feet. Through this program, students will gain a new perspective and the confidence needed to be successful in school, develop personal responsibility, focus on graduating high school and learn of other possible education or careers. Our program is for students ages 12-18 with an emphasis on developing career awareness, community service and opportunities outside their normal day to day environment.

Approved CCYA Young Flyers Students are nominated by pre-approved community partner organizations and the program runs primarily throughout the summer months. The program consists of:

- Two Ground School education sessions that includes exposure to aviation & general career development opportunities, college and technical education opportunities, testimonials from pilots and other expert volunteers and the development of a community service mindset. Students are also required to complete an education book to qualify for their flight.
- **Airport Fun Day** that includes special tours of airport tower, planes, education and additional discussion on careers and community service.
- **Personal flight** in small airplane with an FAA approved flight instructor. Flights are typically 45 minutes with the student participating in actual pre-flight planning, safety checklists, taxi, takeoff, flight and landing.
- Special Trips to additional locations including Columbus State Community College Aviation Mechanics School.
- Year-End Recognition Event to recognize each student for their accomplishments.

Capital City Young Aviators' mission is to provide encouragement, hope and mentoring to local middle and high school students through a unique and exciting life changing experience in aviation, organized mentoring and aviation-based scholarships.

As every private pilot knows, one of the true joys about being able to fly an airplane is to be able to share that unique experience with others and see the true enjoyment on their faces, kids and adults alike.

After serving the youth of our community for over 30 years through numerous organizations as well as being a private pilot for 25 years, I had the opportunity to create a truly unique program for community youth called the CCYA Young Aviators Program. In addition to offering flying as a fun and unique experience to local youth, we believe this opportunity can also act as an impactful life changing catalyst providing the drive needed to each student to not only get through school, but to help them dream about what they might want to do after school as a career.

With our relationship with Capital City Aviation pilot training school, Columbus State Community College, United Way of Central Ohio and many other partners, we are able to work together to provide the experience needed to give each student the chance to not only gain a new experience but also build on their community network & career opportunities. To top it all off, after multiple class situations and airport visits, each student will get to fly in a small airplane (for nearly 45 minutes) and actually take the wheel (yoke) and fly it themselves. A true hands-on experience and feeling of accomplishment to say the least. In addition to the actual flying experience, the CCYA program provides education opportunities, career discussions, and a strong focus on community service, which we believe is a cornerstone to holistic growth as a young adult.

CCYA is a 501C3 non-profit organization and at no cost to the students or their families. We provide our special youth program by partnering with other great youth organizations in the area that nominate students they feel will benefit from an experience like this. To fund this great program, we partner with other great local businesses and donors who make this all happen. It is to all of them that I am truly appreciative. 
# Annual Report - Capital City Young Aviators Annual Report - Capital City Young Aviators (CCYA) Year Ending December 31, 2023




#### 2024 Budget Goals

Capital City Young Aviators relies on the financial support of the community. Through fundraisers, donations and company sponsorship, CCYA is able to fund each student at a cost of approximately \$325 per student. This cost is kept low due to the volunteerism of our board and others committed to this effort. Donors and companies interested in supporting CCYA will know that the majority of all financial support will go directly to the students.

- We continue to have 100% Board financial donation support
- Cost per student projections for 2024 is expected to be \$325 per student
- At close of fiscal year 2023, our net assets were \$11,584.
- Our 5-year income and programming goal includes building a long-term fundraising campaign, adding new company sponsorships and applying for grants to bring in ~\$140,000 of income. This will provide the resources needed to serve over 120 students as well as hire a full-time Program Manager

I have over thirty years of experience in the transportation industry, a majority of that time in the aviation field. During that time, youth outreach and engagement was a priority of mine. ### Kim Emch Founder and Executive Director of Festa

I am the founder and Executive Director of Festa. Since 2007 while serving our neighbors, we have been connecting children and their families to resources. We care deeply about building connections that change lives. One such connection is with Capital City Young Aviators (CCYA). In January 2023, a High School Senior shared with us his dream of becoming a pilot after spending 11 years in a refugee camp and watching one plane fly overhead per month wondering who was flying it and where they were going.

This spring, I had a meeting with Festa's longtime partner, Central Ohio United Way, and I shared the story of this young man's dream and how Festa was working to help him navigate his education options. After hearing my story, they said, "You won't believe this, but right before we got on this meeting", our executive director told us there was a new organization called Capital City Young Aviators, and they were looking for young people who want to experience flying and possibly becoming a pilot. The program includes aviation education opportunities, hands-on exposure to airports, airplanes, and control towers as well as culminating in an actual 45-minute flight around Columbus.

I was able to connect this high school student with CCYA. He joined in 2023 where he had a fantastic experience and ultimately was able to take control and fly a plane, with me as a proud passenger (with an expert trainer of course)! His road to becoming a pilot will be long, but his experience with CCYA was so motivating it gave him the motivation to keep pursuing his dream. This whole experience was at no cost for this young man due to the generous donations supporting CCYA. I hope many other young people get this wonderful experience!

As a ward of the court, I felt as though I was just lost in the system and going through the motions. After I had made enough poor decisions, my social worker sat me down and let me know the work she was trying to do on my behalf was being undone by my poor decisions. This was the wakeup call I needed. Her interest in my wellbeing was motivating...and I wanted to prove to her that her interest was not in vain. I was able to take on my 1st Volunteer position, working at a Retirement Home at

the age of 11, and that further opened my eyes to the value of giving back to the community. Over the years I have Volunteered with the Salvation Army, Youth Sports Programs, YMCA, Future Possibilities, and am now a CASA Guardian Ad Litem for FCCS. These experiences have had a profound impact on me and I only hope each volunteer and child gain the same enlightenment I have received over the years.

Now a CCYA Board member, CCYA encourages our young participants and volunteers to lean into their own experiences and discuss their career paths as well. Our program is officially off the ground, with clear skies ahead, but we are always looking to bring in partners to enrich our program and make sure we don't get stuck in the same flight pattern. If this sounds like a place you'd like to be, whether to help mentor, teach, learn, or grow, come join us, who knows you just might help someone achieve their dreams...that someone could even be you!

Working with kids has always been near and dear to my heart. I have coached youth and high school soccer, taught Sunday school, been a girl scout troop leader, and engaged in several other community service opportunities.
