Accused: Guilty or Innocent?

(4 x 60min, Brinkworth TV, A&E)

Rated the #1 Crime and Justice series on Cable TV in the United States, this highly acclaimed series follows the dramatic stories of people charged with serious crimes and facing prison. Animal Planet's No.1 show follows the legendary work of America's favourite vet, Dr Jeff Young, as he attempts to rescue and treat an extraordinary array of animals.

Homestead Rescue

We follow our homestead experts as they travel deep into the wilderness to answer emergency calls from homesteads in distress. Can they teach these famililies how to defend against dangerous preditors, weather, and how to produce food off-grid, before time runs out?
