# **Using Advent and Christmas well**

These weeks, in the run up to Christmas Day itself, are a great time for <u>reaching out</u> with the good news of the Christmas message – for us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. At this time of year, people in our community are much more willing to come to church than any other. Many will only need a "little nudge" to bring them back to church, or even into church for the first time.

So, a big thank you to everyone who has been delivering lots of our **Christmas leaflets** to streets across our parish. And thank you, as well, to those who have been praying for these cards to do their job. We set the target of getting them all delivered by the end of the first week in December – and we are well on the way to this! More than half the cards have gone out, and already some people from the community are mentioning that they have received one. So, if you are able to deliver some (more) cards over the coming week, that would be wonderful – please have a word with me. And do keep praying for those delivering and for those receiving them.

Of course, a personal invite to a service is often most effective, so maybe we can also think of some who would like that "little nudge".

However, we also want Advent and Christmas to be a special time for ourselves as well – a time for <u>reaching in</u>, we might say - a time to wonder again at the love of God the Father, seen in the birth of Jesus, his one and only Son – for us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. We can take time ourselves to come to some of the special Christmas services and wonder anew. We may also like to pick up a copy of this year's **Advent book**, **The Radiant Dawn**. It has 25 short, daily reflections on parts of Luke chs. I&2, helping us to grasp the full meaning of the Christmas story. ### **New Hall Update**

### **Using the Ephesian Fund**

The PCC has taken the decision to pay our Parish Share through the Ephesian Fund. This change has just gone through.

The *Parish Share* is the contribution that each parish is asked to make towards the Diocese of Chelmsford, to support the stipends and housing of the clergy and the central diocesan costs.

The Ephesian Fund has been set up by the CEEC to help churches that no longer feel able to support their dioceses directly, especially because of decisions around the LLF process. Money for the Parish Share is instead given to the Ephesian Fund, which passes it on to the diocese, with the stipulation that it can only be used to support orthodox, evangelical ministry. This way people can continue to give in good conscience, knowing that their gifts will be used in a way that they agree with.
