# ROANOKE AREA YOUTH SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION RULES FOR 2023 END OF SEASON TOURNAMENT 

## ALL NFHS RULES AS MODIFIED BY THE RAYSA REGULAR SEASON LOCAL RULES SHALL APPLY, EXCEPT:

1. All teams must register and post $\$ 100$ cash NON-REFUNDABLE REGISTRATION FEE at least ten days prior to the start of the RAYSA End of Season Tournament.
2. Players and coaches that appear on a RAYSA regular season roster for that age group may appear on only one tournament team roster. Players may play in an older age group with no restriction for level of play next year. The tournament team roster, consisting of no more than fifteen players and three coaches, must contain player/coach full name, zip code, regular season team, player birth year, and coach's phone number. Final rosters must be turned in to the executive director prior to playing the first game and cannot be changed after the start of the team's first game. Only rostered players and coaches will be allowed in the dugout area during tournament games.
3. Prior to the start of the game, teams are to flip a coin for home/visitor. The flip is to be witnessed by an umpire or other league official. Dugouts are first come, first served. Teams may warm-up on their half of the outfield beyond the base lines (no infield or pitching warm-up on the game field or sidelines). Both teams are to supply two new or near new RIF game balls.
4. Regular season time limits apply (except the tournament director may adjust start times and time limits to meet schedule demands). Game clock will start when the umpires arrive at the field. Tied games must be played until a winner is determined. The regular season tie-breaker rule will apply starting at the end of time limit or in the seventh inning for 17 U games and the sixth inning for all other games, whichever comes first. Curfew limits do not apply.
5. During tournament play, the run ahead rule shall be in effect as follows: a team who leads by twelve (12) runs after three (3) innings, ten (10) runs after four (4) innings, or eight (8) runs after five (5) innings is declared the winner. A team may concede at any time.
6. If a team enters a game with more players in attendance than the opposing team, the team with the greater number of players is only required to play the same number of players as is in attendance for the opposing team.
7. No protests will be accepted. The umpire's decisions are final. Head coaches will be held accountable for the sportsmanship and conduct of their players, fans, and coaching staff. If an individual refuses, when asked to leave the site by an umpire or site supervisor, the game shall be stopped immediately and a forfeit will be awarded to the non-offending team.


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
