8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. - REGISTRATION & WELCOME - Pick up registration packet, name tags, and T-shirts. Souvenir shopping will be available, along with refreshments and light snacks. Raffle prizes will be on display and tickets sold (\$1 for one raffle ticket; \$5 for 6 raffle tickets; and \$10 for 12 raffle tickets - you must be present at time of drawing to win.) 7:00 - 8:00 a.m. - CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST - Assorted pastries or muffins with orange juice, coffee and tea will be provided.

8:30 a.m. - 9:00 a.m. - REFURBISHED BLAISDELL PLAQUE DEDICATION & RIBBON CUTTING CEREMONY - An entrance fee of \$4 will need to be paid upon arrival. The plaque honors the August 15, 1635 shipwreck and landing of Ralph Bleasdale and his family in Pemaquid, Maine. After the dedication and ribbon cutting, supplies will be available to make rubbings of the plaque.

9:00 a.m. - IMPROMPTU BLAISDELL FAMILY PHOTO. Please wear your 2025 BFNA Reunion T-shirt. We will gather around to the plaque to take 2025 BFNA Reunion family photos.

- \* Parking is \$20/vehicle (PAY LOT ATTENDANT) and is available in a gravel/grassy lot located about a 5 minute walk along the rural road. Drivers will drop off passengers at the dock before parking. Location: 89 State Route 39 in New Harbor, Maine.
- \* In order to reduce vehicles needing parking, we recommend carpooling. Please indicate if you need a ride or are willing to share a ride on the registration form.
- \* It can be cool on the water, so bring a jacket or windbreaker, and a hat (with a strap). Wear flat, rubber-soled shoes if possible. Don't forget your sunscreen.
- \* Drinks including sodas, bottled water, hot beverages, beer and wine are available in the galley area on the boat.
- 2:00 p.m. until sunset. FREE TIME ON YOUR OWN. You can tour the Colonial Pemaquid State Historical Site (admission fee is \$4). Fort William Henry Historical Site and Museum is located next to it. You might want to participate in a treasure hunt (map will be provided).

# PRE AND POST TRAVEL SUGGESTIONS FOR ATTENDEES:

- NEW HARBOR, MAINE a small scenic coastal village in the town of Bristol and one of the last working harbors remaining along the mid-coast.
  - Pemaguid Beach
  - Pemaguid Point Lighthouse
  - Fishermen's Museum & Art Gallery
  - Colonial Pemaguid State Historic Site
  - Fort William Henry
  - Rachel Carson Salt Pond Preserve
- YORK, MAINE (located about 2 hours, 4 minutes away) has beautiful beaches and a marvelous
  coastline, along with cliff walks with views of an authentic Maine lighthouse.
  - Cape Neddick Lighthouse
  - Old York run by the local historical society contains 9 restored buildings including the "Old Gaol" which is the oldest jail in America.
  - Blaisdell Family Farm & Cemetery (located at 160 Southside Road, York, ME 03909)
  - Mount Agamenticus with a scenic peak and views of the Atlantic Ocean, Cape Neddick, and the Boston skyline
- PORTLAND, MAINE (located about 1 hour, 24 minutes away) the Old Port waterfront features
  working fishing wharves and converted warehouses with restaurants and shops.
  - Portland Working Waterfront
  - Portland Head Lighthouse
  - A Piece of the Berlin Wall
  - Portland Freedom Trail
  - Portland's Love Locks



- SULLIVAN, MAINE (located about 2 hours, 36 minutes away) incorporated in 1789, Sullivan was named after the Revolutionary War Hero Daniel Sullivan, who lived in Sorrento and died in 1782.
  - Nelly Butler House
  - Sullivan/Sorrento Historical Society Museum & Library
- BANGOR, MAINE (located 2 hours, 4 minutes away) considered the lumber capital of the world.
  - Paul Bunyan Statue
  - Penobscot River Walkway
  - Bangor Historical Society
- SIDNEY, MAINE (located 1 hour, 30 minutes away) incorporated in 1792, and named for Sir Philip Sidney, an English author.
  - Blaisdell Cemetery
  - Reynolds Forest State Park (take a 1/2 mile walk to a beautiful waterfall)
  - Messalonskee Lake
  - Fort Halifax State Historic Site
- BAR HARBOR (located 2 hours, 42 minutes away) situated on Mount Desert Island on the gorgeous Frenchman's Bay.
  - Acadia National Park
  - Cadillac Mountain
  - Egg Rock Lighthouse
- AMESBURY & SALISBURY, MASSACHUSETTS (located about 2 hours, 25 minutes away) Amesbury was incorporated in 1668 and was once the leader in carriage manufacturing and hats. It is
  home to the oldest operating boat shop in America (1793). Salisbury was incorporated in 1639 and
  was once the territory of the Pentucket tribe.
  - Amesbury Carriage Museum
  - Captain's Well
  - Friends Quaker Meeting House
  - Golgotha Burial Ground
  - Lowell's Boat Shop
  - Macy Colby House
  - Susannah Martin Memorial
  - Whittier House (which houses a Blaisdell-made clock from 2 generations of Blaisdell Amesbury Clock Makers)



- WINTERPORT, MAINE (located about 1 hour, 35 minutes away) a historic town incorporated in 1860. Its harbor was home to many sea captains and was the last open inland harbor on the Penobscot River
  - Winterport Union Meeting House
  - Penobscot Narrows Bridge and Observatory the world's tallest public bridge observatory and one of the best observation points in the United States.
  - Fort Knox Historic Site
  - Cole Land Transportation Museum located in the former building of the Maine Central Railroad Company and features a railroad car that plays films about the museum's exhibits
