### **Annual Meeting Update**

Our annual neighborhood organization meeting was held on Saturday, May 11. There were updates provided by Mayor Jeffrey Bernstein, Police Chief Andy Mills

Additionally, the Board announced the awarding of three charitable contributions (read more below) based on our fundraising success during Modernism Week. Last year's slate of board members (Rod Davis, Rob Gallagher, Meredith Gardner, Bill Christensen and Brian Ramos) were unanimously re-elected by the membership for another one-year term.

### A Message from our friends at Oswit Land Trust

Please do not trim palm trees and hedges until after nesting season which ends in September.

When palm trees and other trees are






