Our tour will be on Saturday, February 15th from 12pm to 4pm during Modernism Week's 20th Anniversary!

691 Bedford


Butterfly roof lines always wow visitors and this home, an El Dorado elevation, is no different. With its classic post and beam construction and tongue and groove ceilings, this home takes advantage of both its western and southern mountain exposures with sliders to both the back and side yards. The home has a



custom designed spa to match the trapezoid shape of the pool. Come step inside this sophisticated corner lot home.

632 Beverly

The Beverly is an expanded Alexander home reimagined by David Rios Designs - known for The Trixie Motel and other work. With custom wallpaper and pink accents throughout, you'll feel like you've stepped into a suite at the Beverly Hills Hotel. This home was designed to entertain with two primary suites plus two additional bedrooms. The outdoor space includes a pool and hot tub, but also three entertaining spaces to spread out with family or friends.







640 Compadre

This home was the furnished model home for the Alexander tract. Both the floor plan and elevation were drawn by William Krisel, AIA. The home went through extensive back-to-back renovations including a complete exterior modernization designed to reintroduce many of Krisel's original design elements.

636 Roxbury

This 1957 Krisel home was redesigned in the 1980's by famous Palm Springs designer Steve Chase! The current homeowners have lovingly restored so many of the Steve Chase elements after the home fell into disrepair for decades.

Additionally, the owners were able to locate original Steve Chase designed furniture to complete their restoration.

This home will WOW visitors.



682 Roxbury

This Fleetwood elevation (ceiling sloping from the rear of the home to the front) is decorated in vibrant Palm Springs themes including fun wallpaper accents and natural tongue and groove ceilings. The pool area (visible from a full wall of glass from the living area) is completed by an outdoor kitchen and dining area and a custom wall mural painted by the owners.

October 2024 Modernism Week Update

During October's Modernism Week events, One-PS (the Organized Neighborhoods of Palm Springs) hosted a home tour of five architecturally significant properties throughout the city.

One home in Little Beverly Hills (belonging to Scott & John on Compadre Road) was invited to participate. Over 350 visitors toured the home - along with homes in Vista Las Palmas, Old Las Palmas and the Historic Tennis Club neighborhoods.

The event raised funds for One-PS but also helped introduce more visitors to our pocket mid-century neighborhood. Thanks to Scott & John for opening up your home, again.

Neighborhood History



George Alexander and William Krisel, AIA were presented with the above award as reported in The Desert Sun on March 7, 1958. As the Enchanted Village was the first and only completed neighborhood in the Enchanted Homes series as of the date of this award, it was presented for the Krisel-designed and Alexander built tract in our neighborhood. The next tract (Enchanted Estates in Sunmor) was still under construction.



In Memoriam Patrolman Gale Eldridge



Gale Eldridge First
To Die in Line of Duty

While conducting additional research about our neighborhood, it was discovered that Palm Springs Police Officer Gale Eldridge resided at 634 Bedford Drive with his wife Emelina and three children (Gail, Donna and Bobby). He was a patrolman with the Palm Springs Police Department for less than two years before tragically becoming the first police officer killed in the line of duty in the village. His tragic murder was front page news in The Desert Sun following his death on Wednesday, January 18, 1961. While this was a tragedy for the small village, the

community rallied behind the fallen officer's family, establishing the Gale Eldridge Fund which raised over \$10,000 (\$105K today) from ~350 individual contributions. It is believed that the family left Palm Springs shortly after Officer Eldridge's passing.

According to his family (as of 2013), his legacy continues with four grandchildren, sixteen greatgrandchildren and four greatgreat-grandchildren. Eldridge was 32 years old.





Prescott Preserve Update



🎤 Agreement Reached! 🦫



On November 26th, Oswit Land Trust and Mesquite Country Club HOA reached an agreement in principle after 8 hours of mediation.

The end of the lawsuit regarding Prescott Preserve is in sight.

"Palm Springs, CA: Oswit Land Trust (OLT) and Mesquite Country Club (MCC) are pleased to share with the community that after 2 years of litigation regarding the former golf course, now known as Prescott Preserve, we have reached an agreement in principle, and the lawsuits between the parties are soon to be in the past.

OLT and MCC are grateful for the work done by Mediator David Chapman who for 8 hours listened to the arguments and concerns of both sides, and was able to help the parties reach an agreement benefiting MCC, OLT, and most importantly the entire community of Palm Springs. Both MCC and OLT are looking forward to putting their disputes behind them and working to create a spectacular nature preserve in the heart of our community that everyone will enjoy now and in the future.



Specific details of this resolution are not yet available for the public as the mediation documents are currently being drafted. Therefore, no further comments will be provided by OLT or MCC."
