Beau Pribula was a four year letterman at Central York and a three time captain along with being a three year starter. He also was a first team All State in 6A during 2 of his 4 seasons. Pribula was a 2 time offensive player of the year in YAIAA, a MiniMaxwell award winner. Beau was also a multiple time Sports Shooting Player of the Game. Pribula originally started at safety in high school as a freshman while his older brother Kade started at quarterback. Beau would start his second year at quarterback where he led Central to a 9-2 record and a league championship along with an appearance in the district playoffs. He also threw for 1,244 yards and 8 touchdowns while also rushing for over 300 yards and 10 scores on the ground.

During his junior year is when Pribula took his big steps. He led Central to a 10-1 record during the covid season. He also threw for 2,000+ yards, and 34 touchdowns along with 500 yards on the ground and 14 rushing touchdowns and also completing 67 percent of his passes. The Panthers ultimately won the District 3 Class 6A district championship. Central unfortunately would lose in the State Championship but in Bribula senior season he would complete 73 percent of his passes while leading Central to an 11-1 record and throwing for 2K years and 33 touchdowns.

Pribula would commit to Penn State to play football. During Pribula's first two seasons he would start out as a backup quarterback, but he did however make a few appearances his sophomore year where he threw for 4 touchdowns and ran for 6 after being mostly used as a running QB and sometimes during blowout wins. He also has an NIL with Shipley energy. Pribula enters his junior year hoping to be used a bit more and hopefully his senior year he can potentially become the starter.

Karron Mallory was one of the most highlight reel players in the YAIAA despite only being 5 '11 he also was a multiple time Sports Shooting Stars Player of the Game. Mallory mostly played JV his freshman year and sometimes made appearances off the bench. During his sophomore year however he would become a starter and have a solid season.

As a junior in 2020 Mallory was selected as a first team All County YAIAA, during that season he averaged 12 ppg, and led the Bobcats to a 5-5 record and an appearance in the District 3 5A Playoffs. Karron would then go on to have a huge senior season scoring 18 points per game and leading the Bobcats to a 16-13 record which would include making the YAIAA County tournament semifinals, making it to the district playoffs and eventually making an appearance in the PIAA 5A State Playoffs. One of the games that Karron was most notable in was during a comeback victory over Central York. The Bobcats were down by at least double digits at one point and later during that game Mallory erupted scoring 27 points that night for a career high. Mallory was named co Division 1 player of the year, and also was a First Team All County Selection, he also led the league in 3 pointers that year while shooting 42% from downtown.

In 2023 Mallory would take his talents to Hood College to play basketball, As a freshman he played mostly off the bench behind a very junior and senior heavy Hood squad that made the NCAA Tournament with an at-large bid. Mallory during his first year averaged 3 points per game, his career high so far is 12 points and was 27-83 from the field. He will be looking to have a breakout sophomore year and hopefully get more minutes.

York High has had lots of highlight and skilled players play at the college level, it's hard to compare many to how dominant Jaheim White(aka Florida) was. Jaheim was a multiple time Sports Shooting Stars player of the game even though most of the time teams knew he was getting the ball no one could stop him on ground or through the air. During his freshman year Jaheim White was the backup running back to Tobee Stokes,

Entering his sophomore year Jaheim White was expected to be the starter. White rushed for 1,332 yards and 16 touchdowns during only a 6 games regular season because of covid. White's York High squad made the District 3 6A final where unfortunately they would fall short but he still ran for 107 yards and a touchdown. White's junior year was also something special, he ran for over 2,000 yards and 31 touchdowns. He led York High to a 7-3 record and was named an All State selection in 6A.

Entering his season in 2022 White and York High were expected to take a huge leap. Jaheim ran for 1,918 yards and 37 touchdowns, he also caught 33 catches for 428 yards. One of his game highlights was when he scored 7 touchdowns and ran for 417 yards against Dallastown 6 on offense and 1 on defense. The Bearcat squad(6-4) would make the district playoff against Central York they ultimately wouldn't win but Jaheim had an amazing game tallying 328 yards and 3 scores. White would be selected as the YAIAA Offensive Player of the Year in 2022, The School record holder in rushing yards with (5,780) and be selected as an All State First Team, he was also rated as the 23rd best overall player in the Pennsylvania class of 2023.

He would commit to West Virginia to play football where in his freshman year he would appear in 12 games and start 3 of them. He also earned freshman All American Honors, while also having 842 yards rushing and scoring 4 times. Coming into his sophomore year White is poised to have a breakout 1,000 yard season hopefully and look to maybe potentially improve his draft stock for the future.

Juelz Goff was one our most highlighted players during his high school career, Goff was a multiple time Sports Shooting Stars player of the game and the all time leading rusher in Central York history.

During Goff's freshman year he was mainly behind a pretty deep Central running back room. His sophomore year is when Goff was starting to get going, he mainly split time with fellow back Ajani Walker. Goff ran for 500 yards and scored 8 times that year which landed him a YAIAA All County Second Team. It officially solidified himself as Central's big time running back for the next few years.

During his junior year Goff really took off in a big way rushing for 24 touchdowns and 1,611 yards. He also caught 26 catches for 336 yards and 3 TD's along with 2 kick return scores. He officially had 29 total touchdowns in 2022. At the end of the year he landed as a YAIAA First Team Selection and An All State Selection. One of Goff's notable games came against York High where Central was down a QB and Goff pretty much put the offense on his back "quite literally" He ran the ball nearly every play on offense and even though York High knew he was getting the ball they couldn't stop him.

By the time his senior season rolled around Goff once again had a great year this time rushing for over 1,400 yards and 27 scores even while missing 2 games with an injury. During his game against Red Lion was when he broke the record for the most rushing yards by a Central York running back. He ended his career with his total yards being 3,761 yards rushing. Goff at the end of 2023 was named YAIAA Division 1 Player of the Year and another All State Selection and a Pennsylvania Football Writers All-Class 6A. Goff would commit to Pittsburgh to play college football where he is currently a freshman on the depth chart and has high potential according to some of the coaching staff.

Greg Guidinger is Central York's all time leading scorer and has been an impactful player throughout all of his four years of high school. He was also a multiple time Sports Shooting Stars player of the game and was a multiple time YAIAA Basketball player of the year.

During his freshman year Greg made an immediate impact very early. Despite it not being a great year for Central York, Guidinger managed 15 points per game while shooting 62% from 3. He was named a YAIAA First Team All County. During his sophomore year he was once again named a YAIAA First Team All County unfortunately he dealt with an injury that year which caused him to miss about half the season he did however manage to score 20.5 points per game.

During his junior season Greg was expected to take a big leadership role after Central's lone senior that year Ethan Dodson suffered a bad injury. He wouldn't do it alone however many of his teammates had his back and Central had a bounce back season. Greg would score 16 points per game and was named YAIAA Basketball Player of The Year. Greg would lead the Central York team to a York County Championship title and an appearance in the State Tournament with a young team with mostly sophomores on their team, he would also reach 1,000 points that year.

Entering his senior year Guidinger had lots of high expectations for his team. They were expecting to contend for a District and State title. That year he would break the all time record in Central York basketball points. Guidinger would also lead Central to top seed in District 3 6A and a County Championship once again. Guidinger would average around 20 points per game. Once again he was named YAIAA Player of the Year and an All State Selection. That Panther team would however make a surprise run and win the State Title that year. After the season Guidinger was voted Mr Pennsylvania Basketball. He would commit to Loyola Maryland basketball during his volleyball season. His recruiting process was one of the hardest due to D1 basketball having Covid eligibility, transfer portal, and limited scholarships. Greg hopefully should have a big time college career.
