Merchandise:

Training:

Remember that you must hold a marine radio operators' licence to use a VHF radio. Given the age demographic of the club, first aid training is also recommended. If there are enough interested members in the club we can arrange something at either Bribie Island VMR in the north or Cleveland VMR in the south.

Remember the onus is on you.

Vice Commodores' Tips

Trailers: It is at least as important to have your trailer serviced as your boat. You will do more miles towing your boat than you will do at sea.

I recommend an annual trailer service with a six-month inspection of bearings and grease. If you look at your discs after a trip and you cannot see the evidence of recent braking (shiny discs), your trailer brakes are probably not functioning.

These boats are heavy and trailer failure can be disastrous.
