

Necessary Items For The “Little” Time of Trouble

Those of us that are praying to be part of the “wise virgins” know not where our Lord may send us when this crisis breaks. Lest we arrive at a place of refuge and be a burden to others, it would be good for us to own certain items for each member of our family.

1. A good quality camping tent or if possible, a small camping trailer, where you can have privacy and be protected from the elements
2. A Berkey Filter (one per family) used by the Red Cross, and the U.S. Army when deployed to third world countries. This gravity fed filter allows you to camp by a creek and drink delicious filtered and purified water. [Imperial Berkey Water Filter](#)

4. A good quality LED Handheld flashlight and a “hands free” Headlamp flashlight with rechargeable batteries and DUAL modes so you can read at lower lumens and use it for 40+ hours or see at a distance at higher lumens and use it for 2 hours. [www.surefire.com](#) or [www.streamlight.com](#)
5. A Coleman Army Cot to sleep off the ground. [Coleman Trailhead II Cot](#)
6. A good quality sleeping bag rated down to 0 degrees F
7. A good quality multitool knife (one per family), with pliers, scissors, screwdrivers, can opener, etc. [Leatherman Wingman Multitool](#)
8. A BIC lighter
9. First Aid Kit
10. Raincoat and a hat for the sun and the cold
11. Trash bags
12. Food items that are usually given to refugees: Rice, beans, peanut butter, corn.
