





## **Annual Water Supply Report**

The reports below show our renewable and non-renewable water sources that were delivered to our community in 2024. Our long term plan is to use our available renewable water first, which naturally refills over time with rain and snowmelt. This cycle helps us tremendously to meet the majority of the District's water needs while saving our finite non-renewable water from the Denver Basin (a.k.a. deep well water) for drought contingency.

Cottonwood Water and Sanitation strives to make certain that we are not only delivering high quality water, but we are always taking steps to ensure a sustainable future for our community's water supply. By carefully managing our renewable and non-renewable resources, we can continue to provide safe and reliable service while protecting our long-term water security.





# **Cottonwood Water Hydrant Flushing**

Beginning in March, the Cottonwood Water and Sanitation Operators will be flushing hydrants in the district. Hydrant flushing is an important maintenance process that we (and other water utilities) conduct to maintain our water quality and ensure the reliability of our system. You may see large amounts of water being discharged from the fire hydrants for very short periods of time, and while this may seem wasteful, it is carefully managed and serves several important purposes that benefit our community:

- Improves water quality by removing accumulated sediments at the bottom of the hydrant.
- **Verifies hydrant functionality** to ensure that the units are operational and readily available for fire suppression.

You may notice discolored water in your home due to sediment and mineral deposits that are stirred up during the flushing process. If you experience this during this timeframe, or at any time, please don't hesitate to contact us. This will allow us to locate hydrants near you that will help us address the issue.
