


Don't get caught unprepared! Turn off those sprinklers and get ready for colder weather!



Irrigation Season has come to a close. Please make sure your sprinkler system has been winterized. Freezing overnight temperatures will happen at any time and thus irrigation systems need to be blown out, hoses need to be detached from spigots and drained, mulch needs to be added to planting beds and use tree wrap on new and thin bark trees to prevent sun and ice damage. Blowing out irrigation systems helps prevent freeze damage to sprinklers, backflow devices and places like basements and crawl spaces. As of November 1st your indoor winter allocation will be applied to your water use and billing.
