Long Term Financial Planning

The District has been working for over 20 years to secure and develop its renewable water in an effort to reduce its reliance on the Denver Basin Aquifer. With this in mind, Cottonwood's work for the last 20 years allows us today to deliver to you close to 70% of renewable supply on every gallon of water you use and we are expected to hit 80% within the next couple of years... This has been possible with your support combined with the hard work of your Board of Directors!

There are still a few water supply projects yet to be developed within the next 8 years, starting around 2023. Those projects include the full development of its drought supply water, completion of its share in the Water, Infrastructure and Supply Efficiency ("WISE") remaining capital projects and the District's long-term capital replacement plan for the main components of the water and wastewater infrastructure. With this in mind, the District has developed options for its long-term financial plan to address these goals. As such, the Cottonwood Board desires input from District customers (tenants, homeowners and ratepayers) to discuss the options available to the District for funding these water supply projects and improvements. Through a Citizen's Advisory Committee, staff will discuss/present the District's funding options for capital improvements. It's time to winterize! Irrigation Season comes to a close on October 15th

All of a sudden, fall is here and that means it is time to prepare your irrigation system and landscape for winter. Freezing overnight temperatures will happen at any time now and thus irrigation systems need to be blown out, hoses need to be detached from spigots and drained, mulch needs to be added to planting beds and use tree wrap on new and thin bark trees to prevent sun and ice damage. Blowing out irrigation systems helps prevent freeze damage to sprinklers, backflow devices and places like basements and crawl spaces.

Always consider the following tips before cold weather hits:

- Turn off and drain automatic and manual sprinkler systems before first freeze or before October 15th
- Turn off outdoor faucets and be sure to disconnect hoses from them
- Winterize unheated or vacant building
- Insulate water pipes that may be vulnerable to the cold or have caused problems before
